EXECUTIVE SUMMARY EAST CAROLINA UNIVERSITY FACULTY SENATE MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 6, 1990

The third regular meeting of the Faculty Senate for the academic year 1990-1991 was held on Tuesday, November 6, 1990, in the Mendenhall Student Center, Great Room.

Members from the Research/Creative Activity Committee and the Teaching Grants Committee will conduct two information sessions for faculty interested in submitting proposals for either an Academic Grant or Summer Stipend. The two sessions will be held on Wednesday, November 28, 1990, and Thursday, November 29, 1990, from 3:30 to 5:00 in Rawl #130.

Vice Chancellor Springer, Academic Affairs, spoke about the early tenure process. She stated that there was no policy against early tenure and that Appendix D states that the Chancellor may grant early tenure. However, only in very exceptional circumstances will early tenure be granted, inasmuch as a \$1.5 million commitment is made to that person.

Vice Chancellor Matthews discussed the reorganization of the Division of Student Life. He stated that many of the areas under Student Life had been established autonomously as they were needed and that the reorganization is an attempt to coordinate responsibilities that were fragmented among several offices. There are plans for a new position of Coordinator of Student Wellness. This person will work with health promotion and wellness and later substance abuse as mentioned in the Strategic Plan.

Ciechalski (Education) moved to approve the Fall 1990 Graduation Roster subject to the candidates successful completion of their degree requirements. The motion passed. (Resolution #90-48)

Ferrell (History) presented the progress report of the Ad Hoc Committee to Evaluate Faculty Governance. The committee hopes to have a first draft completed by the end of the Fall Semester. They expect to come up with suggestions for changes for the Senate and some of the standing

committees.

Frank Wondolowski (Business) presented the report of the Credits Committee resulting in Resolutions #90-49 through #90-51.

Richard Miller (Philosophy) presented the report of the Student Retention Committee resulting in Resolution #90-52. The policy presented by Joyce was referred to the Faculty Affairs Committee on a motion by Ferrell (History). (Resolution #90-53)

Bailey (Philosophy) petitioned the Senate to consider motions concerning tenure and promotion policies and procedures. All of the motions passed. (Resolutions #90-54 through #90-62)

Limits on the number of semester hours of credit earned by special examination may be imposed by schools/departments. Credit earned by examination may not be used to reduce minimum residence

requirements.

> Approval will not normally be granted for any course in which the student has been previously enrolled at ECU. An exception may be granted only upon approval of both the Chairperson of the student's major department and the Chairperson of the department offering the course at ECU. That the Undergraduate Catalog, Section 3 (Admission), subsection on Auditors (pg. 35) be modified (additions

Chancellor

Students who have been enrolled at another college or university since their last enrollment at ECU must submit official transcripts indicating eligibility to return to the previous institution. No transfer credit will be awarded for courses taken at any institution of higher education during the initial three consecutive academic years. For courses taken in subsequent years, only those in which the student received a grade of C or better will be accepted for transfer credit at ECU. The sole exception is that students may attend ECU during summer sessions for credit.

- 90-53 The Faculty Affairs Committee is instructed to look into the potential conflict of interest in selecting textbooks and collateral materials and in generating funds for department use by the copy service method. The Committee should report its findings and any recommended Senate actions at the January 29, 1991, meeting.
