Subject: Attached program proposals

Attached are the new program proposals for the 1990-2000 period for the school as requested in the University Mission Review process. The proposals were reviewed by the Department Chairs and the Dean and at the October 9, 1990 Administrative Committee meeting, they were all accepted and by consensus placed in the following priority order:

- 1. Speech, Language & Auditory Pathology doctoral program
- 2. Rehabilitation Studies baccalaureate program
- 3. Biostatistics baccalaureate program
- 4. Occupational Therapy masters degree program
- 5. Speech, Language & Auditory Pathology Institute for Communications Disorders and Aging
- 6. Clinical Laboratory Sciences masters degree program

The Rehabilitation Studies baccalaureate program could be initiated immediately without additional resources. Permission to plan documents for this program are available immediately. The Biostatistics baccalaureate program has strong support from the Department of Mathematics and also could be initiated very quickly and with minimal additional resources. Permission to plan documents could be developed for this program very quickly. The remainder of the programs would require more planning time and a commitment of resources.
