Professor Kobe presented a proposal for PHYE 2777, Lifeguard Training, which will replace PHYE 2779. Richards moved acceptance of the course; Carlton seconded. The motion passed.

Professor Farr presented a proposal to add FORL 2221, Literature in Translation:

The Holocaust to Women's Studies minor, thereby revising the minor. Lapas moved acceptance of the proposal; Cain seconded. The motion passed.

Professor Gonzenbach presented proposals for JOUR 2800, History of American Journalism and JOUR 4000, Public Relations Principles and Writing, thereby revising the BA in Journalism and Mass Communications. Richards moved acceptance as amended; Wilentz seconded. The motion passed.

Professor Collins presented a proposal for LIBS 5520, Genealogy for Librarians. Topper moved acceptance of the proposal; Daugherty seconded. The motion passed.

Page 110, amend:

3. Commercial and Community Recreation: ...and 5 s.h. from the following: LSS 2200, 4700, 5302; PHYE 2777; PLAN 3001; ASIP 2212, 2213...47 s.h.

HLTH 3250, 3251. Sports Medicine Treatment Modalities (3,0)
Prerequisite: HLTH 3220, 3221 or consent of instructor.
Corequisite: HLTH 3240 or consent of instructor.
An in-depth study of theory and application of therapeutic modalities in relation to the treatment and rehabilitation of athletic injuries.

Page 115, add:

PHYE 2777. Lifeguard Training (2)
Two 1 1/2 hour sessions per week.
Prerequisite: Proficiency in basic swimming skills needed in lifesaving. Designed to enhance personal aquatic skills and to develop lifesaving techniques for certification by the American Red Cross.

Page 115, delete PHYE 2779

PHYE 2788. Prerequisite PHYE 2777, or consent of the instructor.

Page 84, amend:

A. Journalism

2. Elective courses selected from the following: JOUR 2800, 3000, 3300, 3700, 3800, 4000, 4400, 4510, 4520, ...

Page 85, add:

JOUR 2800. History of American Journalism (3)
The history of American journalism from its beginnings in England in 1700 to the present.

Page 86, add:

JOUR 4000. Public Relations Principles and Writing (3)
Prerequisites: Journalism 2100, 3000, or permission of instructor. An introductory examination of the principles and processes of public relations with special emphasis on writing styles and techniques.

Library and Information Studies

Page 126, add

LIBS 5520. Genealogy for Librarians (3)
An examination of the roles of libraries and librarians as they relate to genealogical collections and services, including a review of genealogical resources in other libraries, archives, and institutions. An emphasis will be placed on the materials and methods of genealogical research. One or more field trips will be taken.

Leisure Systems Studies

Page 109, revise:

BS DEGREE IN LEISURE SYSTEMS STUDIES

Any student wishing to declare a major in leisure systems studies must, at the time of entrance into the curriculum, possess a minimum GPA of 2.00; have no more than 10 s.h. of general education remaining; have completed ENGL 1100, 1200, MATH 1065, SOCI 2110, and PSYC 1000 or 1050 with a minimum grade of "C"; complete a written application; have a personal interview with the Option Coordinator; and complete a sequencing form (timetable) in consultation with his/her adviser. LSS courses at the 3000 level and above cannot be taken until admission. A student may not declare a major in LSS during Early Registration or for a two-week period beginning with the first day of class.

Any student majoring in leisure systems studies must maintain (1) an overall GPA of 2.0, and (2) an overall GPA of 2.0 in all concentration courses to remain in good standing. Any student majoring in LSS must earn a minimum grade of "C" in all required LSS prefix courses. A student wishing to appeal should contact the LSS Coordinator within 2 weeks of notification.
