Corrections to the Minutes of February 18, 1991: JOUR 4000 revised the minor in Journalism. The minutes were approved as amended.

Professors White and Moore presented a request to change the title of PHYE 3300 to Applied Sports Psychology. Richards moved acceptance of the proposal; Harris seconded. The motion passed.

Professor Daugherty presented a proposal for revision of the BA in Art History. Grossnickle moved acceptance as amended; Shea seconded. The motion passed.

Professors Horns and Cox presented proposals for revision of the following courses: NURS 2400, Introduction to Health Assessment; NURS 4000, 4001, Family and Community Health Nursing and Practicum; NURS 4360, Research in Nursing; proposals for the following new courses: NURS 2401, Introduction to Health Assessment, Practicum; NURS 2700, 2701, Introduction to the Nursing Process, and Practicum; NURS 3000, 3001, Nursing of Adults I, and Practicum; NURS 3700, 3701, Nursing of Adults II, and Practicum; NURS 3800, 3801, Psychiatric/Mental Health Nursing, and Practicum; NURS 4701, Senior Practicum; and a request to exempt registered nurse students in NURS 3900, 3901 from NURS 2700, 2701. Shea moved acceptance as amended; Wease seconded. The motion passed.

The Committee discussed information for the Annual Report.

The Committee agreed to the proposed change in the Curriculum Committee Charge. The number of committee members for a quorum will read: "7 elected faculty members exclusive of ex officio."

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Page 115, add

PHYE 3300. Applied Sports Psychology (3)

Prerequisites: PSYC 1000 or 1050, 1051.

Designed to explore psychomotor theory as it applies to athletic performance and coaching. The focus will be on the understanding and enhancement of psychomotor skills related to optimal athletic performance.

Page 184, revise

B. Art History Major

Minimum degree requirement is 120 s.h. of credit as follows:

1. General education requirements (see Section 6, The General College REQUIREMENTS FOR BACCALAUREATE DEGREE PROGRAMS) including ANTH 1000, HIST 1030, 1031; 2 courses to be chosen from ENGL 3460, 3600, 3610; PHIL 2271 44 s.h.
2. Foreign Language (French or German) through level 1004.....12 s.h.
3. Required courses in art history: ART 1905, 1906, 1907, 4980, and 3 courses which cover art before 1800; 3 courses which cover art after 1800. (African Art will be counted in the latter category; History of Prints and Drawings may be counted in either category30s.h.
4. Students may select a concentration in either studio art or liberal arts courses.
 - a. Art Concentration:
Art studios: design, ART 1005, 1015; drawing, ART 1020, 1030; art surveys (9 s.h.); art electives (may be taken in art history) 6 s.h..... 27 s.h.
 - b. Liberal Arts Concentration
Electives from Anthropology, English, Foreign Languages, History, Philosophy, and Area Studies (may include a maximum of 6 s.h. art history electives)..... 27 s.h.
5. General electives to meet minimum requirements for graduation.
6. Acceptance of a senior paper in art history is a requirement for graduation.

BS DEGREE IN NURSING (BSN)

Minimum degree requirement is 126 s.h. of credit as follows:

1. General education requirements (see Section 6, The General College: REQUIREMENTS FOR BACCALAUREATE DEGREE PROGRAMS) including cognate courses: CHEM 1120, 2620, 2621; PSYC 1050, 3206; SOCI 2110; 3213, 3214 or equivalent..... 44 s.h.
2. Professional Nursing: NURS 1000, 2400, 2401, 2700, 2701, 3000, 3001, 3060, 3400, 3401, 3500, 3501, 3700, 3701, 3800, 3801, 4000, 4001, 4200, 4202, 4320, 4360, 4600, 4601, 4701..... 62 s.h.
(RN students only: NURS 3900, 3901 exempts them from NURS 2700, 2701.)
3. Required cognates: BIO1 1050, 2110, 2111, 2130, 2131, CDFR 1103 15 s.h.
4. Electives..... 5 s.h.

Page 258, revise

NURS 2400, 2401. Introduction to Health Assessment; Practicum (2,1)
Two classroom and two laboratory hours per week.
Prerequisites: NURS 1000; BIOL 1050, 2130, 2131; CHEM 1120, 2620, 2621; Corequisites: NURS 2400, 2401, 2700, 2701; BIOL 2110, 2111. An introductory course designed to offer students a knowledge base in general principles of health assessment of well clients. Practicum designed to practice and demonstrate a comprehensive health assessment.

NURS 2500, 2501 DELETE

NURS 2600, 2601 DELETE

NURS 2700, 2701. Introduction to the Nursing Process; Practicum (3,2) (Formerly NURS 2500, 2501)
Three classroom and six laboratory hours per week.
Prerequisites: NURS 1000; BIOL 1050, 2130, 2131; CHEM 1120, 2620, 2621; Corequisites NURS 2400, 2401; 2700, 2701.
Provides an introduction to the basic concepts of nursing. Practicum provides the student an opportunity to apply basic concepts and skills of nursing.

NURS 3000, 3001. Nursing of Adults I; Practicum (4,2) (Formerly NURS 2600, 2601)
Four classroom and six laboratory hours per week.
Prerequisites: NURS 1000, 2400, 2401, 2700, 2701; BIOL 2110, 2110, 2130, 2131; Corequisite NURS 3000, 3001.
Provides theoretical bases for applying the nursing process in the care of adults experiencing alterations in health. Practicum applies the nursing process in caring for adults experiencing alterations in health.

NURS 3100, 3101 DELETE

Page 259, revise

NURS 3700, 3701. Nursing of Adults II; Practicum (2,3) (Formerly 3100, 3101)
Two classroom and nine laboratory hours per week.
Prerequisites: NURS 3000, 3001; PSYC 3206; CDFR 1103; Pre or corequisite: NURS 3060, 3700, 3701.
Provides additional theoretical bases for applying the nursing process in the care of clients experiencing alterations in health. Practicum applies the nursing process in caring for adults experiencing alterations in health. Focus is on the adult as a family member.

NURS 3800, 3801. Psychiatric/Mental Health Nursing; Practicum (2,3) (Formerly NURS 4400, 4401)
Two classroom and nine laboratory hours per week.
Prerequisites: NURS 3000, 3001; PSYC 3206; Corequisite NURS 3800, 3801. Concepts of mental health promotion, maintenance, restoration, and theoretical foundations upon which to base nursing intervention with individuals and families. Practicum provides opportunities to apply the nursing process with individuals, families, and small groups needing mental health promotion services or early detection, treatment, and rehabilitation for psychiatric/mental health/illness.

NURS 3900, 3901. Concepts in Professional Nursing; Practicum (3,2)

Corequisite: NURS 3900, 3901.

Introductory course and practicum required for registered nurse students. Examination of the theoretical foundations of professional nursing practice, application of nursing process, and utilization of nursing research. Practicum provides RN students opportunities to apply the theoretical foundations of professional nursing practice and the nursing process with clients in a variety of practice settings. (Successful completion of N3900 and N3901 exempts RN students from N2700 and N2701.)

NURS 4000, 4001. Family and Community Health Nursing; Practicum (4,3)

Four classroom hours and nine laboratory hours per week.

Prerequisites: All required nursing courses below 4000 level.

Corequisite: NURS 4000, 4001.

Synthesizes knowledge from previous courses and public health concepts to develop nursing care for families, groups and communities as clients.

Practicum utilizes the nursing process and concepts of public health in care of families, groups and communities in a variety of settings.

NURS 4360. Research in Nursing (2)

Prerequisites: all 3000-level nursing courses, one statistics course; SOCI 3213, 3214; or permission of instructor.

Introduction to nursing research methods, with emphasis upon the application of the research process and critical review of contributions in the health fields.

NURS 4400, 4401 DELETE

NURS 4701. Senior Practicum (4)

Prerequisite: Senior standing.

Seminar and clinical experiences during the final semester before graduation to provide opportunity for strengthening professional nursing behaviors in the care of individuals and families in primary, secondary or tertiary care settings. Students will negotiate for concentrated clinical practice in the form of preceptorships in a selected agency.
