Report to the Board of Governors Estimates of Regular Term Enrollments for 1991-92

At its meeting on August 9, the Board of Governors established the enrollments upon which the 1991-92 institutional budgets are based. The anticipated enrollment levels are specified in budgeted, regular term, full-time equivalent students (FTE's). In accordance with Board policy, projected enrollment for each institution was expressed in terms of a range. Board regulations require a further report on enrollment from the President in November when more precise estimates of annual enrollments can be made. This report is in response to that requirement.

Enrollment in regular term full-time equivalent students (FTE's) for 1991-92 is now estimated to be 125,585, or 670 more than the budgeted midpoint of 124,915 FTE's. This estimated enrollment of 125,585 is within the cumulative enrollment range set by the Board (122,415 - 127,415), and it represents a growth of 1.8 percent (2,257 FTE's) over the 1990-91 enrollment of 123,328. Most of the growth is accounted for by the increase in the enrollment of North Carolina residents.

The following table presents the estimated enrollments and the established 1991-92 ranges for each institution:

As shown in the table, the estimated enrollments for ten of the seventeen budget units (codes) are within the established enrollment ranges:

Appalachian State University; East Carolina University; North Carolina Central University; North Carolina State University; The University of North Carolina at Asheville; The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Academic Affairs; The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Health Affairs; The University of North Carolina at Greensboro; Western Carolina University; and Winston-Salem State University. Four institutions are above the ranges: Fayetteville State University; North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University; The University of North Carolina at Charlotte; and The University of North Carolina at Wilmington. Three institutions, Elizabeth City State University; North Carolina School of the Arts and Pembroke State University, are below the ranges.

Board regulations further require that, upon review of enrollments, consideration be given to any need for the transfer of appropriated funds between institutions which are under or over the levels established by the Board. The regulations state the following conditions regarding such transfers of funds:

- (a) No transfers are contemplated to or from an institution whose enrollment appears to be within the range set by the Board.
- (b) Transfers will be considered from an institution whose enrollment is less than the low-point of the range set by the Board.
- (c) Transfers will be considered to an institution whose enrollment is not more than 2 percent over the high-point of the range set by the Board, in the event that there are funds available for transfer as a result of the conditions set forth in (b).
- (d) Transfers to an institution whose enrollment appears to be more than 2 percent over the high-point of the range will be considered only to the extent of the first 2 percent of such excess.

Concerning the three institutions -- Elizabeth City State University, North Carolina School of the Arts and Pembroke State University -- whose estimated enrollments are below the authorized ranges, it is recommended that no reduction be made in their respective academic budgets. Transfers of any size, in the aftermath of the legislative cuts in the continuing operations budgets, would create serious problems. Since no transfer of funds is proposed from the three institutions whose enrollments are projected to be below the low-point of the established ranges, no funds are available for transfer to the four institutions with enrollments projected to be in excess of the established ranges.

The Board's regulations also provide that an explanation will be required from the Chancellor of any institution for which enrollment is estimated to be more than two percent in excess of the top of the established range, together with the comments and recommendations of the President. Two institutions have enrollments sufficiently in excess of the range to require special attention. They are: North Carolina A & T State University and The University of North Carolina at Wilmington. As required by Board policy, these institutions have given reports explaining the circumstances that led to enrollments significantly in excess of the levels authorized.

At North Carolina A & T State University, the increase in enrollment was considerably greater than expected because of (1) a sizable increase in the proportion of students who are full time, (2) improvements in retention rates, and (3) an increase in the application and yield rate for North Carolina freshmen. Through control of admissions for the second semester, and closer monitoring of application and retention rates, it is expected that enrollments can be brought within the authorized range in 1992-93. No additional action is needed.

At <u>UNC-Wilmington</u>, the enrollment in excess of the budgeted level is substantial. Several factors brought it about. In the fall of 1990 for the only time in its history UNC-Wilmington had a slight decline in its enrollment, largely due to a sharp drop in the size of the freshman class (25 percent). The decline in freshmen enrollment at that time reflected, in part, a decrease in the percentage of accepted students who actually enrolled. The intent for the fall of 1991 was to build the freshman class back up to 1,300 (after the decline from 1,509 to 1,120), but this year the percentage of accepted students who enrolled went up sharply. The result was a freshman class of more than 1,500. The increase in transfer students enrolling was even higher, up by 70 percent over the fall of 1990, from 548 to 941.

Enrollment of new freshmen and transfers will be drastically curtailed this spring, and for the fall of 1992 new transfers will be held at 550 and the freshmen class to about 1,200. No other action is called for at this time, but it will take some time for UNC-Wilmington to return to a more normal condition. The President will work with the Chancellor to deal with this problem.

Again this year, it should be noted that overall enrollment growth seems to be related primarily to improved retention rates and increases in the enrollment of transfer and graduate students. The number of graduates from all North Carolina high schools continues to decline (from 73,105 in 1989 to 67,736 in 1990 and to 65,664 in 1991). However, there is a slight improvement in the going-rate for the 1991 graduates who enrolled as freshmen at UNC campuses. The 1990 rate was 23.7 percent, and this year it is 24.1 percent. The total number of first-time freshmen is almost unchanged this fall as compared with 1990.
