Dear Doctor:-

I have your's of August 12th, 1928.

So far as we are personally and officially concerned, we are wholly dependent upon the treasurer's book and a man must not only be a member thirty years, but he must have paid his dues consecutively for the same number of years.

You are credited for half of the dues during that period of time on the treasurer's book. Since 1903 the State Society have always been paid through the Secretary of the local County Society so that you have of course two possibilities of error, one in the State Medical Society and one in the local County society, at any rate that is the way the matter stands and there is no possible way of crediting it that I know of except to pay the dues that are not credited.

I am sure that I appreciate your position very greatly and I am anxious to do anything in the world that I could do to help straighten the matter out in accordance with your idea, however, I am helpless in the matter. In the early records of the society around 1900 and behind, we have been able to show an error in giving credit by the then treasurer by the doctor presenting receipts, but I believe only in two instances. There are probably others of course and your's may be one of them, at any rate I am anxious and willing to do anything I may be able to do to help take care of the matter.
