Pointing You in the Right Direction

A Portion of Founders Drive to Close

Preconstruction site preparation for the new Science and Technology Building will begin this summer. Founders Drive currently travels directly through this area. Thus, beginning in late June or early July 1999, Founders Drive will be closed between Christenbury Gym and the English Annex. The campus community will be notified via email announcements of the specific dates for street closings and parking adjustments.

What does this mean to you?

- ☛ No through traffic on Founders Drive between the English Annex and Christenbury Gym.
- ☛ Staff parking south of the Flanagan Building will convert to resident and handicap parking.
- ☛ Staff parking east of the Flanagan Building will convert to handicap parking.
- ☛ Only Umstead/Slay resident students, Health Services patients, maintenance, service, emergency vehicles, and vehicles with handicap permits will be permitted beyond Wright Circle to the area south of the Flanagan Building.
- ☛ A temporary roadway will be built with entry/egress from E. Tenth Street for warehouse traffic, maintenance, service, and emergency vehicles only.
- ☛ Dowell Way, near Fletcher Residence Hall will reverse directions. It will become ONE WAY exiting the campus toward Fifth Street.
- ☛ The private lot (P2) adjacent to the General Classroom Building will be removed. The lot situated between the Austin Building and Rawl Building will be reopened and designated for private (P2) permits.



Rapid Shuttle Service Allows an Alternative to Parking in the Central Campus


Let's face it, times have changed, and the convenience of parking right outside of your office or dormitory is changing too. With the numerous construction and renovation projects planned for the ECU campus and the projected increase in enrollment, students, staff, and faculty may be looking for alternative parking places sooner than they think. Did you know there are several hundred EMPTY PARKING SPACES not utilized each day, and at all times of the day?

The new stadium parking lot holds more than 600 vehicles and is virtually unused on weekdays. Better yet, the new lot and the other lots adjacent to Minges Coliseum are served by ECU Transit Rapid Shuttle Service, with buses arriving and departing regularly on class days.

Rapid Shuttle Service is available between the Rapid Shuttle lots and Christenbury Gym; and between these lots and Joyner Library, Monday through Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. If you are remaining on campus after 6:00 p.m., ECU Transit Service is available until 10:00 p.m. for the return trip.

ECU Transit is funded mostly through student fees; however, ECU Parking and Transportation Services also provides some funding, including a portion of the annual staff parking fee. Staff and faculty should feel free to use the transit services as an alternative to trying to park on campus. An ECU One Card is all that is needed to ride. ECU Transit schedules are available in Mendenhall Student Center.

Planned Changes Related to Construction of Science & Technology Building



HIGHLIGHTS of Other Projects and Temporary Adjustments

- Student Health Center Expansion: A portion of the RESIDENT lot north of Slay Residence Hall will be utilized for the construction area. Anticipated to begin June 30, 1999.
- Gray Gallery Project: Several STAFF spaces in the lot situated between Jenkins Art and Garrett Residence hall will be utilized temporarily for a laydown site. Anticipated May 1999 - January 2000.
- Renovations to former Print Shop in Old Cafeteria Complex: Several STATE OWNED VEHICLE spaces will be utilized temporarily for a laydown site. Anticipated April 1999 - October 1999.
- "Smart Classrooms" Upgrade Projects: Several STATE OWNED VEHICLE spaces east of Austin Building will be utilized over the summer. Anticipated May 1999 - August 1999
- Cooling Tower Project: Several RESIDENT spaces in the lot north of Slay will be blocked temporarily as a safety precaution during installation.

Please drive carefully as people become accustomed to these changes.

Early Registration for 1999-2000 Permits

Students, staff and faculty may register vehicles for the next academic year beginning in May. Students enrolled for fall should receive a vehicle registration application by mail over the summer. The deadline for students to register a vehicle and have the permit mailed to their permanent address is July 23, 1999. After that date, students must register in person.

New this year is ON LINE VEHICLE REGISTRATION for enrolled students. This service is available via the "Student Desktop" at www.student.ecu.edu and allows students to complete an application form and make payment by Visa or Mastercard, or they may print the form and mail it with a check. Decals will be mailed to students upon receipt of payment.

Staff and faculty who do not have a multi-year permit must register their vehicle(s) and obtain a new permit. Multi-year permits are valid through August 1, 2000, and do not require the owner to re-register until summer 2000. Information regarding staff and faculty vehicle registration will be sent via campus mail later this spring.

As announced last year, the annual parking fees for 1999 - 2000 will increase. The parking fee for Resident, Commuter, Freshman, Handicap, and Staff/Faculty will increase to \$120. The Limited permit will increase to \$60. The Limited permit is available to students residing off campus who have earned 31 or less credit hours; or to any student, staff or faculty member wishing to pay a lesser parking fee for limited parking privileges. The private parking permit fee will increase to \$360, with a waiting list for those interested.
