


I will certainly do anything I can to help the catfish farmers and will express my support for your position to the Department of Agriculture.


Incidentally, we all appreciated your part on the program at Winston-Salem. You are a great sport!

The potential for increasing agricultural income in North Carolina through catfish farming is a realistic endeavor. It has been brought to my attention that government assistance to catfish farmers now is

available through the United States Department of Agriculture, United States Department of Interior, and under President Nixon's proposed executive branch reorganization, would also include the Department of Commerce.

The North Carolina Catfish Farmers Association in conjunction with the Catfish Farmers of America feel that their position would be enhanced by the United States Department of Agriculture having the total responsibility for government assistance in working with the catfish industry.
