





CLIFFSIDE AMPHITHEATRE was built for professional theatre productions in 1960. Its site at GRAND-VIEW STATE PARK is across from a breathtaking overlook of the New River Gorge Canyon. Hiking trails, sports facilities and lush plant life makes Grandview an attraction by itself. A day at the park and an evening of theatrical entertainment under the stars is an unforgettable experience that has brought hundreds of thousands of visitors from all over the world. A variety of motels, campgrounds and restaurants are within a short drive from Grandview. Two of the most beautiful resorts in the nation are also convenient: Glade Springs and Pipestem.

THE NEW RIVER GORGE BRIDGE at Fayetteville is the world's largest steel arch bridge, spanning 1700 feet with a 360 foot rise. Supported by nine land piers, it is also the second highest bridge in the United States. Canyon River State Park is located at the north end of the bridge with several vantage points and a gift shop.

THE BECKLEY EXHIBITION COAL MINE provides a fascinating view of the coal mining process from early manual methods to contemporary mechanized techniques. Over the past twenty years a half million travellers have taken the train into the mine guided by a retired coal miner. His stories and comments give an insider's knowledge of an important part of West Virginia's heritage.




