my Dearest Mother:-

Mail came today but brought me no letter from any one. we get some little mail, however, each day and probably tomorrow yours will come. Have just read one of the boys letters and his people remarked that they were getting his mail regularly now.

We are living pretty easy these days. Our work is policing up portions of the forest. We had 3 square miles assigned to us

last week. But this afternoon we were sent over to clean up two german gun positions. we found lots of shell cases, and shells. They were six inch shells and the cases would make beautiful jardineers. if a fellow had any way to get them home.

There are shell cases of all sizes. One of the men has one large enough to make a umbrella rack of. It is the case of a naval rifle shell.

we are all on our heads to get started homeward, and the air is ringing with rumors continuously, but all prove to be false.

I saw in the "Stars and Stripes" the 30 Div. was to go soon, but we have not been with our infantry since they left Camp Sevier so we are afraid we won't get off with the main body of the division.

I suspect you have gotten my cablegram by this time. I fear you were a little uneasy on receiving it but you will find it allating good news. I saw in the papers cablegrams were being held up because so many were trying to get them thru.
