I send for Wile's six papers of powder tred together, a wiel and love. I bisside one of the papers of powder equally and give him half of it immediately mixed with molapses or preserved syrups, and continue to give him half of one of the papers of powder every two hours until the fever subsides or until it papers through his leaves once. If his fever lowers and rises again give the powders as about until the fever is much lower or water it papers once through his leavests.

brop enough from the piol on the cloth in the top of the close to moisten it (say twenty to to fifty drops) and apply it the top of the look immediately to the back of his neck - It must be prefect down close to prevent the feemes from escaping and held on until he complains that it beens him. Apply the look in this way to two or three different places on the back of his neck and if his head is not relevant try it on his temples. If it should not produce a burning sensation in four or fine minutes pour more of the medicine from the viol on the cloth and apply it again.
