



Vice Chancellor for Research and Graduate Studies

East Carolina University seeks applicants and nominations for the position of Vice Chancellor for Research and Graduate Studies. The Vice Chancellor provides vision and leadership for activities related to the promotion of research. The position is also responsible for providing guidance and resources for the development and implementation of graduate studies across all academic divisions. The Vice Chancellor reports to the Chancellor and is a member of the Executive Council. She/he represents the campus in matters relating to research and graduate studies to the Chancellor, the University of North Carolina, government agencies, private foundations, national organizations, industry, the local community, and the media.

Specific responsibilities include:

- supervision and leadership for sponsored research, technology transfer, compliance, regulatory review committees, and interdisciplinary and international research programs;
- supervision of the Dean of the Graduate School who has responsibility for the interpretation, evaluation, and administration of the academic standards and regulations of the Graduate School; the funding and monitoring of graduate assistantships; and the planning and implementation of new graduate programs;
- fostering faculty development through the funding of summer research stipends; intramural academic year project grants; seed monies for research-related activities; and research awards for faculty recognition;
- acting for the Chancellor in the review and approval of proposals for extramural funding and in the acceptance of extramural grants and contracts for research, training, and service;
- accountability for the responsible conduct of institutional research activities; and
- playing a major role in strategic planning as it relates to graduate education and establishing an appropriate infrastructure to support a growing research agenda for the university and working closely with the Provost/ Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and the Vice Chancellor for Health Sciences to insure the effective use of available resources.

It is essential that the successful candidate be able to demonstrate a commitment to excellence in scholarship, support of shared governance, and an established record of effectiveness as a leader beyond the departmental level with experience in strategic planning, budgetary management, administrative processes, and staff development. She/he will have a record of distinction in scholarship sufficient for appointment as a tenured full professor within one of the university's departments. An appropriate terminal degree is required.

The Vice Chancellor collaborates with the Provost/VC for Academic Affairs and the VC for Health Sciences to make recommendations to the Executive Council and the Chancellor on all matters relating to research and academic program development. Direct reports to the Vice Chancellor for Research and Graduate Studies are the Graduate School, the doctoral program in Coastal Resources Management, the Institute for Coast and Marine Resources, the Office of Technology Transfer, the Coastal Studies Institute, the Office of Sponsored Programs, and the program in Diving Safety. East Carolina University, a constituent institution of the University of North Carolina, is the fastest growing university in the UNC system.
