Subject: Heads Up for Tuesday Senate Meeting

Fellow Senators,

Our first Faculty Senate Meeting of this academic year is next Tuesday, September 11, 2007, in the Mendenhall Student Center, Great Room. The agenda for that meeting is very full and I anticipate that issues important to each of us will be discussed. I am sending this email to give you a "heads up" so that you can be prepared for the various discussions.

At each Senate meeting, one of the vice chancellors is asked to address us. This month, Provost Marilyn Sheerer will be speaking to the Senate. The Agenda Committee has forwarded a list of issues the committee would like her to address. These issues include:

- How will the restructuring of the Divisions of Academic Affairs and Student Life affect ECU faculty, students, and the rest of the ECU community?
- How will the restructured Division better serve the faculty and students?
- What is your vision of shared governance?
- What is being done to address the problems with the implementation of Banner?

There are other speakers and issues to discuss. For example, Terry Holland, Director of Athletics and Brenda Killingsworth, Chair of the UNC Faculty Assembly, are on the agenda and there will be a vote for members of the Hearing committee.
