



Faculty Senate Meeting February 23, 2010

The Department of Sociology is very concerned about the proposed changes to the "Serious Illness and Disability Leave for Faculty Policy". There are a number of issues in the proposed changes that we believe as concerned social scientists require further research and serious consideration. As ECU is becoming a more diverse community, illness, disability, and maternity leaves affect different populations differently, a fact to which our policies should be sensitive. Before accepting these changes, we urge the ECU Administration to task the Faculty Welfare Committee with determining the needs for these specific changes in policy, the impacts on all those directly affected by these changes, and the documented benefits to the ECU

university community.
