### **Faculty Senate Resolution #08-52**

Approved by the Faculty Senate: November 4, 2008

Rejected by the Chancellor: December 12, 2008, based on the fact that the guidelines for this review are set by the University of North Carolina General Administration and no further guidelines are necessary.

#### **Guidelines for Reviewing Low Productivity/Low Enrollment Programs**

Alignment with UNC Tomorrow, ECU Tomorrow, and ECU Strategic Plan

- How is this program supporting progress toward identified goals?

Societal Need

- Does the program meet specific societal needs (i.e., demographic needs such as employment)?
- Do graduates from degree program have a skill set in high demand area in either private or public sectors?
- Does growing demographic demand for skill set exist?

Community Engagement and Impact

- Does program offer engaged learning component of benefit to students and eastern North Carolina communities through internships, service learning, and engagement with public and private entities?

Increasing Access and Innovative Program Delivery

- Are there plans in the immediate future to increase number of degrees granted through expanded access (e.g., distance education, opportunities to military personnel and dependents)?

Value in Support of other Programs

- Does curriculum support degree programs in other areas or interdisciplinary programs (e.g., BA/BS K-12 degrees in the same field)?

Admission/Graduation Criteria and Statistics

- Are admission or graduation criteria so rigorous as to significantly limit admissions or graduation rates but result in high caliber student or graduate population?
- Does course sequence impact student retention and progress toward graduation?
- Does program admit and graduate a high percentage of applicants from traditionally underrepresented populations?
- Do program graduates pass national licensing/certification exams at equal to the national rate or higher than the national rate?

Faculty Pool

- Would additional students be admitted if program had more faculty?



- Does presence of program enhance the ability to recruit and retain highly qualified faculty?

#### Financial Resources

- How does the graduate degree program support faculty research and creative activities?
- Is the unit able to continue fiscally supporting the program?
- Are external funds available to offset the lack of program graduates?
- Are external funds available to support students?

#### Demonstrable Potential for Growth

- Does program have a plan (including business plan and timeframe) for increasing productivity?




Educational Policies and Planning Committee  
Meeting Minutes  
November 12, 2010

- I. Call to order: Scott Gordon, EPPC Chair, called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. on November 12, 2010 in Rawl Annex 142. The following persons were present:

Absent: Marianna Walker, Ed Stellwag
- II. The minutes of the October 8, 2010 meeting were approved as submitted.
- III. Unfinished Business: Chancellor Ballard's proposed revisions to the *ECU Faculty Manual*, Part V. Academic Information, Section III. Curriculum Development  
A motion was passed to take off the table a motion to add the following sentences to C.2. New Minors, Certificates, Concentrations; Degree Title Changes; Teacher Licensure Areas; and Discontinuing Degree Programs: "The Chancellor and his or her designee with consent of the Chair of the Faculty Senate may establish deadlines by which each person and/or committee listed must report its concurrence (approval) or non-concurrence with the proposed action. Failure to report by the established deadline shall be considered an abstention and the proposed action shall progress to the next level for consideration." The Chair read the untabled motion and opened the floor for discussion. Following discussion, an amended motion was made, seconded and passed to add the following sentences to C.2. New Minors, Certificates, Concentrations; Degree Title Changes; Teacher Licensure Areas; and Discontinuing Degree Programs: "The Chancellor or his or her designee in consultation with the Chair of the Faculty may establish deadlines of not less than two weeks by which each person and/or committee listed must report its concurrence (approval) or non-concurrence with the proposed action. Failure to report by the established deadline shall be considered an abstention and the proposed action shall progress to the next level for consideration." This revision will be added to the draft of Part V. Academic Information, Section III. Curriculum Development that was circulated with the October 8, 2010 minutes.
- IV. New Business
  - a. EPPC's role in the Unit Academic Program Review process.  
Dr. Griffin reviewed the October 22 Unit Academic Program Review Workshop and noted that Professors Gordon and Lewis represented the EPPC at the workshop. The committee reviewed the flow chart and checklist/timeline on pages 10-11 of the *Procedures for Unit Academic Program Review*. Dr. Griffin asked whether the Task Force's understanding of the role of the EPPC in the process matched the committee's understanding. Following discussion, a motion was made, seconded and passed as follows: "The EPPC will review the




Self-Study, Review Committee Report, and the Unit Response Plan which is the product of Step 8 on the timeline on the checklist included in the *Procedures for Unit Academic Program Review*. The EPPC will provide an appropriate response to the Coordinator prior to Step 9 on the timeline for consideration in the preparation of the draft Final Action Plan." Following discussion concerning the type of review to be conducted by the EPPC, a motion was made, seconded and passed that the EPPC will review the Self-Study, Review Committee Report, and the Unit Response Plan for issues that fall within the committee's charge. Dr. Griffin will send the committee the documents for the Department of Chemistry and the School of Communication for discussion at the December 10 meeting.

b. Review of Low Productivity Programs



A faculty member requested that the EPPC start immediate action on the list of low productivity programs distributed by the UNC Office of the President. To facilitate discussion of this request, Chair Gordon distributed a copy of the list, Faculty Senate Resolution #08-52 (which was rejected by the Chancellor), and the section of Part V of the *ECU Faculty Manual* dealing with discontinuation recommendations resulting from the Board of Governors' low productivity review. During the discussion, it was pointed out that the Board of Governors guidelines supersede Part V in the area of review of low productivity programs and that the review procedures listed in Part V have not been followed for a number of years. A motion was made, seconded and passed with one abstention that as a committee, we ask the Chair to write a memo to the Provost and the Vice-Chancellor for Health Sciences asking them to inform the EPPC if they make a decision to discontinue a program.

V. Announcements

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- a. The Chair and Professor Lewis participated in the interview of a candidate for the position of Coordinator of Academic Program Development.
  - b. Professor Sid Rachlin of the Department of Mathematics, Science, and Instructional Technology Education sent the Chair a memo asking that the department's request for a new teaching field option for mathematics education in the Master of Arts in Teaching degree be placed back on the table. The Chair will find out if there is a set procedure for such requests and if there is an appellate procedure for the denial of requests by the EPPC. The Chair clarified that the denial of the request was presented to the Faculty Senate as an informational item, but that the Senate did not vote on it and that in the case of denials, the EPPC does not give a timeline or suggestions to the department, but simply votes to approve or deny the request.

VI. Adjournment

There being no further business, Chair Gordon adjourned the meeting at 3:40 p.m.
