NOMINATING COMMITTEE FOR FACULTY OFFICERS REPORT ELECTION OF FACULTY OFFICERS

Candidate for Chair of the Faculty

Marianna Walker, College of Allied Health Sciences

As Chair of the Faculty, I have advocated for having faculty at the table when discussing academic matters of importance and involving the standing University academic committees in reviews of matters under their purview. During 2010-11, faculty have been involved in many initiatives requiring increased levels of commitment. Recently the Chancellor charged two academic committees to play key roles in addressing the budget situation and potential effects on academic programs. I am appreciative of the Chancellor's positive responses to our request to increase faculty involvement in a myriad of critical decisions involving academic matters at this time.

I am especially grateful to the faculty who, in addition to traditional responsibilities (teaching, research, and service), have stepped up when asked to get involved. The need for faculty engagement will be equally intense during the 2011/2011 academic year and I will work to see that faculty continue to maintain this level of involvement and communication with administration. Faculty must maintain an active role in the protection of our academic programs. The Faculty Senate will reorganize the *ECU Faculty Manual* and continue to address issues relating to online teaching tandards and curriculum issues, retention, and SACS accreditation.

Candidate for Vice Chair of the Faculty

I have served as Vice Chair of the Faculty for the last two years, and in that capacity I have been an advocate for transparency and faculty participation in important policy decisions. I serve as an elected member on Academic Standards and the Hearing Committee. I represent the Chair of the Faculty on the Graduate School Advisory Board. I am a member of the Faculty Manual Advisory Committee, the SACS Faculty Workgroup, the SACS QEP Council, and the Patent Committee. I also represent ECU on the UNC Faculty Assembly and serve on the Faculty Assembly Executive Committee. Much of our effort this year have been on faculty manual revisions, which are nearing completion, but now we must decide how we will organize the new manual in a way that it is accessible to everyone. Perhaps the most critical issues facing ECU next year are those involving budget cuts. The Faculty Officers regularly meet with the Chancellor and Academic Council to discuss faculty-related issues. This year many of these discussions have focused on the budget. The budget will likely be the main focus at these meetings next year as well. We face important ecisions about short-term and long-term budget cuts, and it is important for faculty to be involved in the discussions. If I am reelected, I will continue to advocate for faculty and the academic core at hese meetings and in every aspect of my duties. Thank you for the opportunity to serve in this important leadership role.

Candidates for Secretary of the Faculty

Nelson Cooper, College of Health and Human Performance

am pleased to be nominated as a candidate for Secretary of the Faculty for the 2011-2012 term. My 18 years of experiences at East Carolina University include perspectives as a Graduate Assistant, a fixed-term Instructor, a probationary Assistant Professor, and a tenured Associate Professor in the Department of Recreation and Leisure Studies. I am entering a second term as a faculty senator for the College of Health and Human Performance. In addition to serving on departmental personnel, search, assessment, and program review committees, I have also successfully fulfilled responsibilities as an officer in a state professional association. In 2009 I completed the ECU Chancellor's Leadership Academy, and I also served as a member of the 2010-2011 Faculty Senate Agenda Committee. All of these experiences have provided me a comprehensive perspective of the University culture. Hunt McKinnon, Department of Interior Design and Merchandising

I would like to be re-elected as Secretary of the Faculty for three straightforward reasons-

1) Continuity: I think the lean budget period we are now experiencing makes it very important to keep the officers that are now in place working without interruption through the summer. This is not the time to initiate new officers because many administrative decisions will be made with or without the voice of the faculty this summer.

2) Capability: The job of the Secretary is more than keeping the minutes. He or she meets with the other officers and with administrators on a weekly basis; there is a responsibility to be clear and to help develop consensus as well as to write the journal of what we are now experiencing

3) Diversity: The position of Secretary is the only office that can be filled by a fixed term faculty member. This 30.5 % of the faculty (1) that is currently the most vulnerable to being dismissed as if they were casual labor. I believe in the notion that East Carolina University should continue to be a true Community of Scholars and thus that people with different teaching, clinical, and research interest should be welcomed here.

Thus, I am running for re-election based upon the difference that my perspective brings to the job, and my interest and proven ability.

Andrew Morehead, Department of Chemistry

Why have I chosen to run for the office of Secretary of the Faculty, and more to the point, why should you vote for me? To the former question, I have chosen to run because I have had a long-term interest and belief in strategic planning, shared governance, and service to the university. I believe there is a balance between teaching, research, and service. Each of us should strive to maximize our impact on the academy in all those areas, but most particularly in our area of strength, and those efforts should be rewarded. I also believe we are stronger as a group than we will be individually. To the second question I pose above (Why should you vote for me?), I would tell you that I am a person who has always believed in open lines of communication and a thoughtful consideration of the benefits and weaknesses of any move. I am a pragmatist who recognizes that no choice is ever without flaws and that the people who comprise an organization as complex as a university will never unanimously agree on anything. 1. Name: Writing Across the Curriculum Committee

2. Membership:

8 elected faculty members with a variety of disciplinary areas and colleges/schools.

Ex-officio members (with vote): The Chancellor or an appointed representative, the Provost or an appointed representative, the Vice Chancellor for Health Sciences or an appointed representative, the Chair of the Faculty, one Faculty Senator selected by the Chair of the Faculty, the Director of the University Writing Program, and one student member from the Student Government Association.

The chair of the committee may invite resource persons as necessary to realize the committee charge. The chair of the committee may appoint such subcommittees as he or she deems necessary.

3. Quorum: 4 elected members exclusive of ex-officio.

1. Committee Responsibilities:

- A. The committee promotes the University Writing Program and recommends policies and guidelines governing the development and offering of courses and seminars that are officially to be designated as writing-intensive courses.
- B. The committee reviews and approves proposals for writing-intensive courses, makes recommendations to the Faculty Senate regarding proposals carrying the writing intensive designation, and reports those recommendations to the University Curriculum Committee.
- C. The committee periodically reviews existing writing-intensive course offerings and recommends, as appropriate, changes to course writing-intensive status in order to ensure that standards for writing-intensive credit are being met.
- D. The committee reviews the activities of the University Writing Program, advises the administrative leadership in that program, and serves as a liaison between the University Writing Program and the Faculty Senate.
- E. The chair or appointed representative serves as an ex-officio member of the Honors College Advisory Committee.
- 5. To Whom The Committee Reports:

The committee reports to the Faculty Senate recommendations of policies, procedures, and criteria governing the development and offering of WI courses. The committee recommends curricular changes to the University's writing-intensive requirement to the Faculty Senate.

How Often The Committee Reports:
The committee reports to the Faculty Senate at least once a year and at other times

as necessary.

7. Power Of The Committee To Act Without Faculty Senate Approval:

The committee is empowered to advise the office of the University Writing Program as described in 4.D. above.

8. Standard Meeting Time:

The committee meeting time is scheduled for the second Monday of each month.

Ex-officio members (with vote): The Chancellor or an appointed representative, the Provost or an appointed representative, the Vice Chancellor for Health Sciences or an appointed representative, the Chair of the Faculty or an appointed representative, one Faculty Senator selected by the Chair of the Faculty, and one student member from the Student Government Association.

The chair of the committee may invite resource persons as necessary to realize the committee charge. The chair of the committee may appoint such subcommittees as he or she deems necessary.

- 3. Quorum: 4 elected members exclusive of ex-officio.
- 4. Committee Responsibilities:
 - A. The committee recommends policies, procedures, and criteria related to the Service Learning Program.
 - B. The committee promotes service learning across the university and recommends means to identify success in service learning activities. The committee assists units requesting aid in developing service learning courses, assist with learning outcomes and goals for service learning courses, and serves as a resource for service learning. The committee provides a forum for faculty opinion concerning academic service learning activities related to the curriculum.
 - C. The committee makes recommendations regarding proposed changes, including individual courses, in the service learning designation. The committee makes recommendations to the Faculty Senate regarding individual courses carrying

- service learning designation and reports those recommendations to the University Curriculum Committee.
- D. The committee serves as a liaison between the office of Service Learning and the Faculty Senate, reviews the activities of that program, and advises the administrative leadership in the Service Learning Program.
- E. The Committee reviews at least annually those sections within the *University Undergraduate Catalog* that correspond to the Committee's charge and recommends changes as necessary.
- 5. To Whom The Committee Reports: The committee reports to the Faculty Senate its recommendations of policies, procedures, and criteria cited in 4. above. The committee recommends curricular changes to the university's service learning requirement to the Faculty Senate.
- 6. How Often The Committee Reports:
 The committee reports to the Faculty Senate at least once a year and at other times as necessary.
- 7. Power Of The Committee To Act Without Faculty Senate Approval:
 The committee is empowered to advise the office of the Service Learning Program as described in 4.D. above.

Quorum: 4 elected members exclusive of ex-officio.

4. Committee Responsibilities:

- A. The committee reviews program quality and policies and future directions relating to distance education.
- B. The committee examines and recommends policies relating to distance education.
- C. The committee ensures timely, informed faculty opinion on any technology action in any area that may affect significantly the University's academic mission. The committee recommends policy related to the academic use of technology. [All information technology actions that affect more than one academic unit or that are initiated above the academic College or School department levels are recognized as actions that may affect significantly the University's academic mission.
- D. The committee initiates, reviews, and makes recommendations on proposals to plan, implement, revise or eliminate technology initiatives, goals, standards, policies, procedures or actions that significantly impact the University's academic mission.
- E. The committee prepares and makes available a format for proposals requesting permission to plan, implement, revise or eliminate an information technology initiative, goal, standards, policy, procedure or action.
- F. The Committee reviews at least annually those sections within the *University Undergraduate Catalog* that corresponds to the Committee's charge and recommends changes as necessary.
- G. The chair and vice chair or appointed representatives serve as ex-officio members of the Information Resources Coordinating Council (IRCC) and the chair serves as a member of the Technology Steering Committee.
- H. The chair serves as a liaison between the Faculty Senate and Chief Information Officer.
- To Whom The Committee Reports:
 The committee reports to the Faculty Senate its recommendations of policies, procedures, and criteria cited in 4. above.
- 6. How Often The Committee Reports:
 The committee reports to the Faculty Senate at least once a year and at other times as necessary.


