Many opportunities for synergy exist but there are voiced concerns about the disruptions and costs to all involved in the proposed changes. Merging with other schools could mean a loss of identity for all programs involved. Because we are the largest College of Nursing in the state and we are a nationally designated Center of Excellence, we believe that it is important to maintain our identity as a College of Nursing. Therefore, faculty want to remain a College of Nursing only.

In general, the faculty believe the most feasible and least disruptive approach is to merge departments within a college or a school.

Overall, it's important to weigh the short term cost containment decisions with long term strategic consequences of the proposed changes.
