3. The ABLE Division is in need of strikers for the Engineman, Machinist Mate and Machinery Repairman rates. 4. SUNBATHING:
(a) Sunbathing is permitted only at the following times:

Sunbathing is permitted only at the following times:

1. On weekdays from 1130 to 1300 and from 1600 to 1800.

2. On Saturdays from 1130 to 1600.

3. On Sundays from 0800 to 1600, except during Divine Services.

(b) Sunbathing is permitted in the following places:

1. For enlisted men on the decks of the after-superstructure and on the main deck aft of Frame 93.

2. For Officers on the Ol level forward and the sky defense station forward.

(c) Sunbathing is prohibited in places other than those listed above and is expressly prohibited in all gun tubs and boats.

(d) Sunbathing is prohibited at times other than those listed above, and during general visiting hours if the visiting hours are included in the hours listed.

(e) The removal of prescribed articles of the uniform of the day such as jumpers, dungaree shirts and undershirts during working hours in order to acquire a suntan is prohibited.

(f) Indecent exposure is prohibited at all times.

(g) All hands are cautioned that extremely painful burns may result from over exposure to the sun, especially in the tropics.

Therefore, exposures should be limited to very short periods until the skin is well tanned. Care should be taken not to go to sleep while untanned areas of the skin are exposed.
