

WACCAMAW HISTORY

The USS Waccamaw was built by the Sun Shipbuilding and Drydock Company during 1945-46. She was commissioned on 25 June 1946. The ship is named for the Waccamaw River, which flows from Lake Waccamaw in North Carolina into Winyah Bay, South Carolina. As shown in the statistics table, she is 553 feet long, with a 75foot beam and a full-load displacement of 25,000 tons, including six million gallons of liquid cargo. She delivers fuel oil, aviation gasoline and jet fuel to ships at sea through six rigs of large hose.

Jaccamaw has made nine deployments in support of the Sixth Fleet in the Mediterranean. These deployments have been about seven months in length. She returned from the most recent one in March 1963, having steamed over 26,000 miles and pumped some 29 million gallons of fuel to ships alongside. This required 300 individual fuelings. These fuelings (and similar operations by Waccamaw's sister support ships) result in multiplying the effectiveness of the Fleet. In fact, it means that the Fleet can be where needed, where needed for as long

as needed.
