In the article on the family which we heretofore sent you and which no doubt has reached you by this time, we left out a number of the members of our family who have not sent me in sufficient information to trace their genealogy back to the Landgrave. I may be able to send you this later, but I am not at all sure so do not wait for it. I am very anxious to receive a copy of what you are preparing, concerning our family, for the new publication, and I will certainly appreciate the opportunity to read it.

I am sending you, herewith, enclosed a copy of an old letter written by Gerard deGraffenried in 1865. Do you know who he was and to what branch he belonged and from whom he was descended? We are not able to locate him at all.
