# STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

To William Z. Montan Greeting:

WE, reposing special trust and confidence in your patriotism, valor and military skill, do hereby commission you a Second Lieutenant in the Fourteenth Regiment of North Carolina Militia: And you are hereby vested with all the authority and privileges belonging to said office, that you may promptly and diligently perform the duties thereof: In the discharge of which, all subordinate officers and soldiers are required to yield you their ready attention and obedience, after you shall have taken oaths to support the Constitution of the United States, and the Constitution of the State of North Carolina.

In witness whereof, His Excellency, JONATHAN WORTH, our Governor, Captain-General and Commander-in-Chief, hath signed with his name these presents, and caused our Great Seal to be affixed thereto.

Done at our City of RALEIGH, on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and in the ninetieth year of our Independence.
