Dear Mr. Spilman: -I have your favor of December 19, 1934 in regard to new Electric Receptacles and Light Outlets in your residence. These I have marked on blueprints and will see that they are put in place as designated. The one light in small hall, second floor, appears to me hardly needed, as the new closet and the disappearing stairway (which I believe you contemplate installing) will occupy most of this space. There is at present one light over main stairs, second floor ceiling, and I believe this will give sufficient light. With Mrs. Spilman's approval, I have given Jones Bros. Contractors drawing and order to install Chairrail in first floor hall at \$18.85. At the request of Mrs. Spilman, I have received a price of \$48.95 for Plaster Cornice in first floor Stairhall. This, with Living Room and Dining Room plaster Cornices, (\$143.50) will total \$191.95. Awaiting final approval, I have not given the order, for this to Jones Bros. The cost of Garage (footings of which are already in place) will be \$500.00. This will have brick walls to eaves line at gables, siding above that.
