Note.—Any Person writing on this Ticket, after it is issued, is guilty of a Misdemeanor.

The Owner of this Ticket is required to deposit it with the Master of the Vessel in which he engages to serve, and the Master is to return it to him at the termination of his service. Any Person becoming illegally possessed of this Ticket, and representing himself as the Owner thereof, will be guilty of a Misdemeanor, and liable to fine and Imprisonment.

If any Person shall alter or destroy, counterfeit, transfer, or traffic in, for gain or otherwise, any Register Ticket, he shall for every such Offence, be guilty of a Misdemeanor; and any Person being possessed of a Register Ticket other than that legally issued to him, shall transmit the same to the Registrar of Seamen, Custom House, London, and in case of default, he shall, for every such offence, forfeit and pay a sum of Twenty Pounds.

Should this Ticket become defaced or worn out, a new one may be obtained by rendering it up to the Registrar of Seamen in London, or the Collector and Comptroller of Customs at any Port of the United Kingdom.
