

We are requesting your presence as a witness at this hearing. You may testify generally or you may address any of the pending bills aimed at providing special relief to family farmers.


The hearing will be held in the Dirksen Senate Office Building, Room SD-106, on Tuesday, November 12, 1985 at 10:00 a.m.
