My Dear Sister:

As I have neglected writing to you wont you please excuse me. I will attempt to answer your highly appreciated letter received Friday evening. I certainly was pleased to here from you. I am getting along fine dont haft to get my lessons lower but had a fine speech Friday. I wish you could of seen me on the rostell reading my piece. You certainly would laugh but my sweet littel girl had a fine speech Leslie didnt say one. Well I dont recon you wont to know anything about my girl. Sister how are you getting along do you like the girls? How Dis Wannie know I saw Frank yesterday he said that he and Cousin Don was up there Friday but didnt tell you. Has Lula gotten any so better? I have just come from the Drs. Leona and Mabel is sick, and littel Glora, certainly looks bad. Uncle Aaron has been sick with cold, Aunt Addie has joined the ~~baptist~~ baptist church and was bapitized last Sunday you can imagine that the water was cold. I took her to

church and the water and back home but she said that she didnt get cold much Uncle Aaron was not able to go and ask me to take her, Sister Millie Barrett Mother died last Sunday Mr. Thorne went to her byaring, and some of the scholars but I didnt go I didnt certainly did want to go it was a sad death I did certainly like Willie and Lucy, Oh! Oh! I saw Minnie Raspberry the other day and she was looking sweet as a June peach, I havent seen Eddie Smith since you have been gone Leslie and I keep to gather he is getting along fine like the girls to beat the band and has caught him a girl went to a party the other night and his girl lost her overshoe and Leslie was out early the next morning looking for them and Joe told it on him and the boys has nearly teased him to death I got home that day about three oclock or some after left town about 12 oclock I did want to see you all again but thought probly that you had gone in the school room, How did you like that sweet kiss I saw you get at the door, I am still laughing about that all day I saw Mr. Leaver on the street after that then.

I spent Friday night with Michal it was so cold that I couldnt walk home that night and she was at work Lizzie was there we went to a party at Cousin Jim Jones and you bet it was not cold but we had a nice time all the neighborhood were there w/bs of candy and I got sweet one time if candy will buy one Michal said you promised to write first.

Went to see Ellen, Alice last Sunday Mr. Alfred Forbes was there they are certainly lively girls havent caamed the least bit and can see I have the same old ring I dont care what she thinks she is not the only bebble on the beach ~~the~~ or the only rag doll in town I havent seen Gold since that Sunday evening Oh dont you some of my paper its in it the lines I ever saw I know that turkey and cake was good to you.

Tell Marnie I can certainly sympathize with her for the tooth aches. but I certainly do miss you very much dont know what I would do if I was at home all the time. Carl said did you want him to write again. I must close as it time for me go and its raining now my feet are cold I answer soon to
