them to sell for eating.

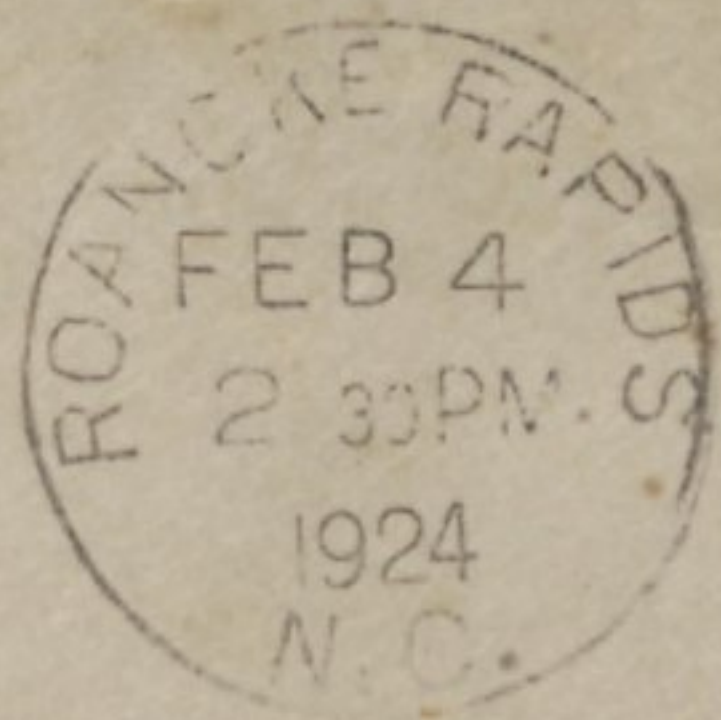
Have you seen Leonard
