As we heard, you said you had never been to a late show, if it would be all right with your mother we will go when I get home. The reason I want your mother's O.K. is that I want to keep in good with her. So if it is O.K. with her we will go and of course if any of the boys want to ride over with us they can. That is if it is O.K. with you.

Darling, it was mighty sweet of you to say what you did about me. I would tell you how much I love you if it were possible but there are not words enough to tell just how much I love you.

Honey, the way you said only three more weeks sounded mighty good and I hope they go by real fast. So I can be in heaven real soon again as I was last week end.

Well, my Dear, I guess I'll close now. So until I received your answer.

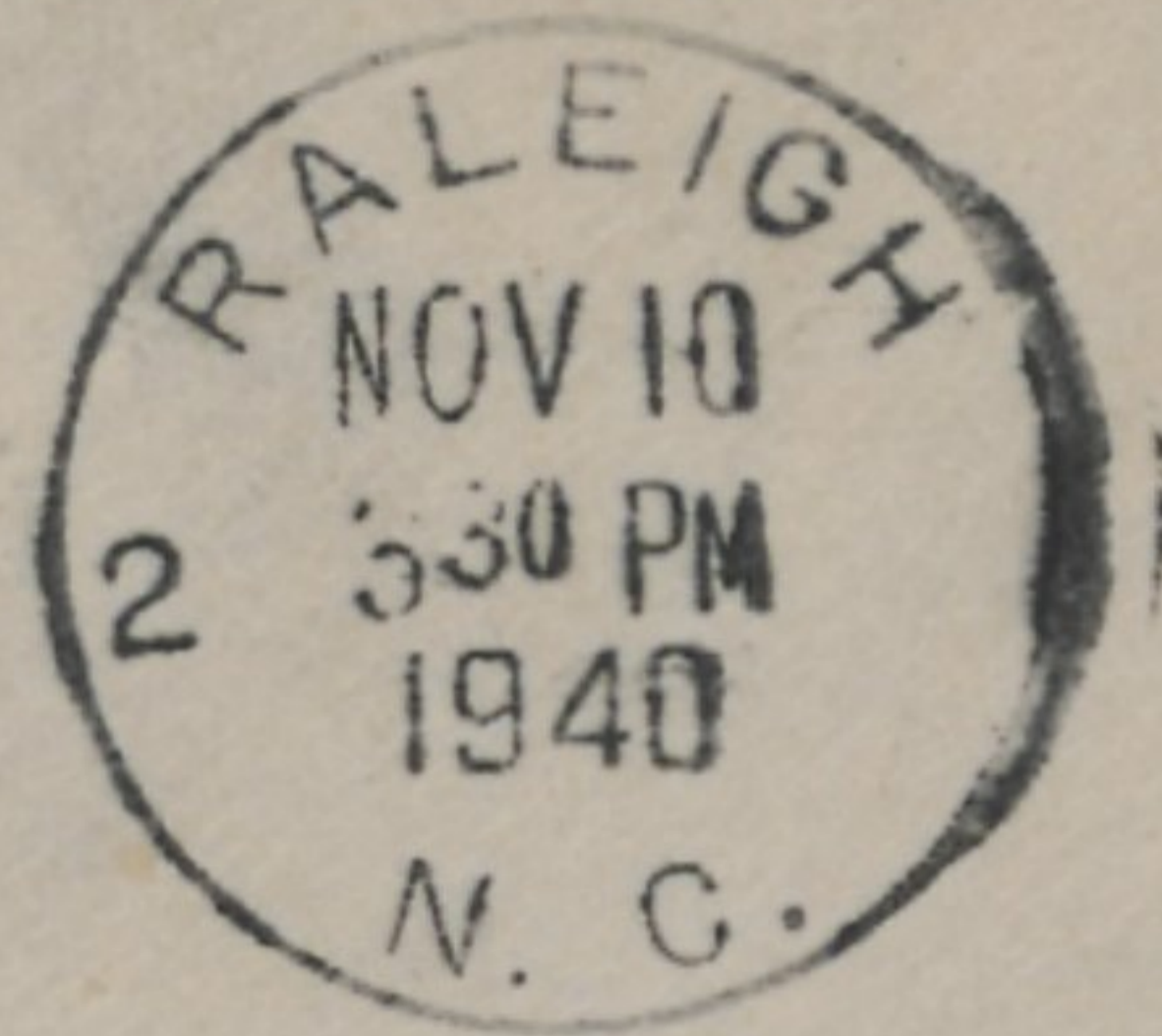
