



"Camp Amory"

Newbern Nov. 20 1862.

Dear Brother

It is very stormy today and not being on duty I thought I would improve the time by writing a few letters as it is hard telling when I shall get another chance.

Yesterday we were inspected by Major Gen. Foster and staff, and were complimented very highly by him.

Solph is very busy today oiling the guns.

The 43rd Regt. are encamped a few rods from us and last night a party from the 45th

went over and persuaded
Lieut. Schuler.

Nov. 21st

Dolph and Mr
Woodman started this
morning for Newburn
to get some tools to
fix the guns for the
company; they got very
rusty during the passage.

Col. Peabody drilled
the company this morning
as skirmishers.

I want you should
send me some postage
stamps and a few
dollars in plain places.

All the boys are well
and wish to be
remembered to you.

Four men go out from
our company to-morrow

on picket duty.

I expect I shall
be detailed next.

Al is well and says
he shall write in a
few days.

Give my love to
Kate and all the
folks at home and
accept much from
your affect. brother
