Corsairs Crush Kinston Kagers

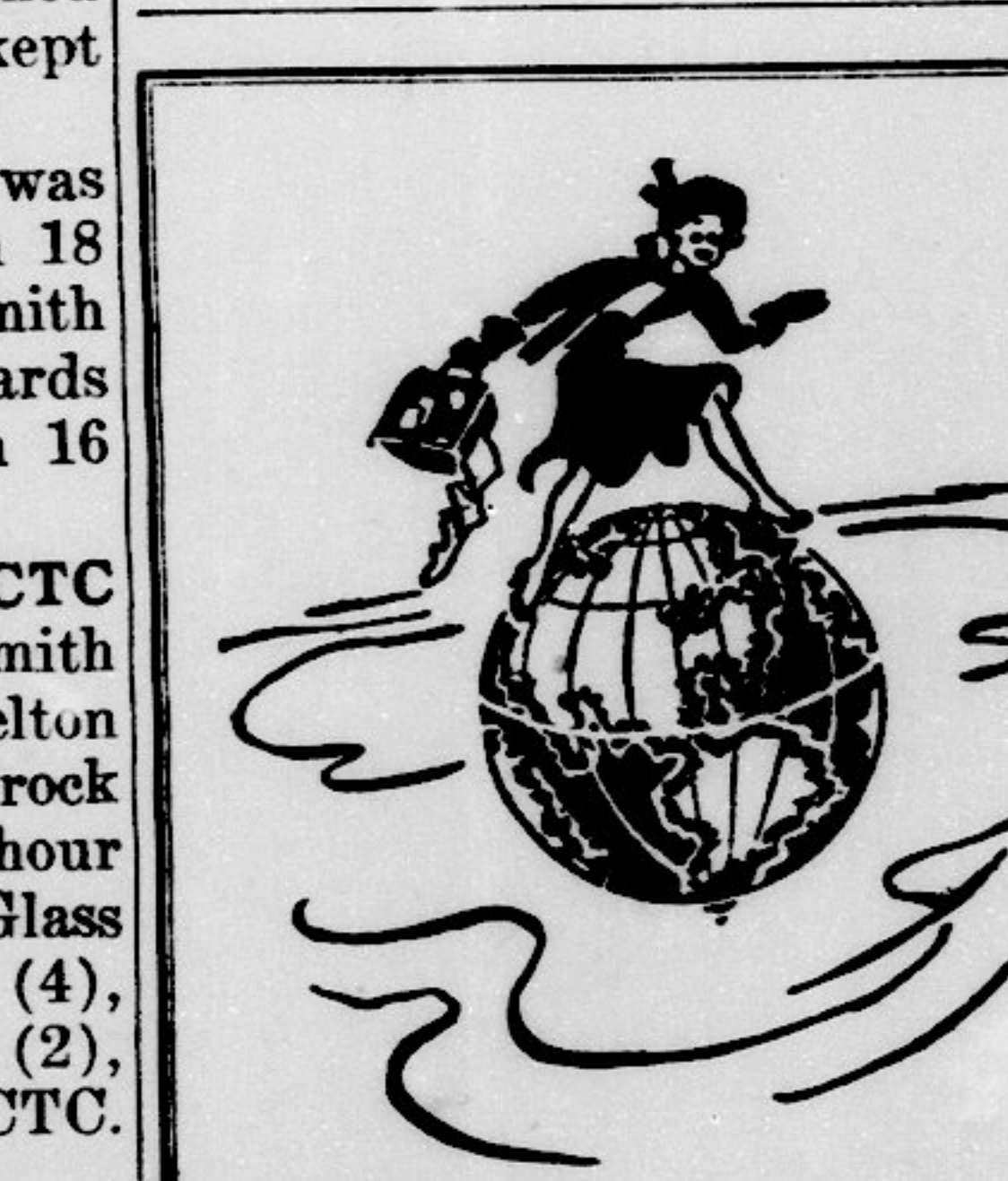
Teachers Take Tilt To Tune Of 63 To 26

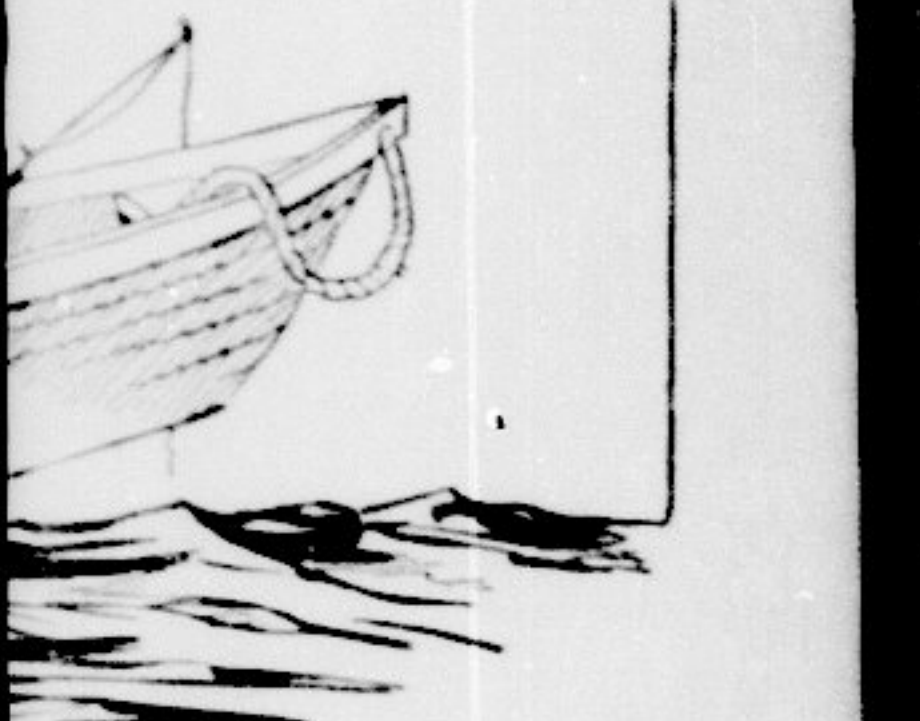
