#### THE NORTH CAROLINA JAZZ ENSEMBLE

The band was organized in the Fall of 1980 by Oliver Hodge and Stanley Baird. Hodge is a professional bass player who has played with a number of top professional musicians and is now teaching instrumental music in the Durham City Schools. Baird is a saxophonist who has also played and recorded with some of the top names in the jazz circuit, including the Donald Byrd band. He has also worked with and directed the NCCU jazz ensemble and is now teaching instrumental music in the Warren County School System.

The membership includes blacks, whites, and female musicians. Professional musicians from outside the triangle area are also participants. These persons are employed as university, high school, junior high school, middle school, and studio instrumental music teachers. Also, retired professional musicians, university and high school students and persons working in other areas but have had extensive training and experience in jazz ensembles, help make up the group.

The first appearance was on the campus at NCCU honoring those persons in the triangle area who had made significant contributions in music. Among those present and performing were Mickey Tucker (a pianist whom *Downbeat* has featured as one of the top performers in jazz), and Shirley Caesar, gospel's great.

The band has performed for the following: Senior Citizens in Chapel Hill, Arts Festival in Durham and the Arts Council in Durham. Other performances include: parents and student body at NCCU, students of commerce at NCSU in Raleigh, Committee on Black Affairs at NC Mutual in Durham, Black Enterprises in Durham, Chancellor Leroy T. Walker's retirement at NCCU, the Jazz Mill in Chapel Hill, NC Guardsmen and a number of dances in North and South Carolina.
