A Loss of \$165.

We were shown by Col. F. W. Foster to-day a section of a sawed log with a small cannon ball embedded in the center of it. The tree from which this section was taken, was felled on the bank of the Northeast river near the Big Bridge ferry. The ball was shot into the tree by either the Confederates or Yankees, at the time Hoke's division crossed the river in 1865, retreating from the squadrons of Scofield and Terry.

Col. Foster says that while this peice of timber was being sawed, the saw struck the ball and ruined it, entailing a loss upon him of \$165.
