## GENERAL COURT, MARCH 1708

Peterson versus Keele In Debt

No. Carolina

This bill bindeth me Robt. Keel of Pasquetank my Heirs executors or Assignes to pay or Cause to be pd. unto Mr. Thomas Peterson in behalfe of New Pensylvania Company his or their Assignes or Order the full and Just Sume of two Pounds fourteen Shillings and Halfe penny To [illegible] good Sound merchandable neet fresh Porke to be brought to Mr. Jno. Jennings house in Pasquotank upon demand Ass Wittnesse my Hand this twenty Eight day of March 1705.

No. Carolina Ss. To the honorable the Generall Court etc.

Thos. Peterson Attorney to Micajah Perry and New Pensilvania Company is plaintiff against Jno. Lawson Defendant in a plea of Debt and Sayes that the Defendant stands Justly Indebted to the plaintiff in the Quallification aforesaid in the full and Just Summe of Twelve pounds Nine Shillings and Nine pence in Merchantable Skins and furrs at a price agreed upon as in and by one Certaine writeing Obligatory under the proper hand of the said Defendant beareing Date September the 30th 1704 and here into Court brought relation being thereunto had doth and may appeare Nevertheless the Said Defendant the aforesaid Summe of Twelve pounds Nine Shillings and Nine pence in maner aforesaid to the plaintiff hath not paid tho' often thereunto requested but the Same doth Still refuse to pay to the plaintiffs Damage (in the aforesaid Qualification) Twenty four pounds Nineteen Shillings and Six pence Sterling and thereupon he brings this Suite etc.

Know all Men by These presents that I Joseph Pegge of pascotank In North Carrolina planter do bind my Self my heirs Executors and administrators to pay to Thomas Peterson (On account of the New Pensilvania Company) his administrators and assigns the Just Sum of Twenty One pounds Eleven Shillings and Six pence Currant money of the province as Wittness my hand and Seal This 12th day of March Anno 1705/6.

The Condition of this Obligation is such That if the Above bound Joseph Peggs, his Executors and Asigns do well and truly pay Unto the abovesaid Thomas Peterson his administrators Or Assigns the full Sum of Ten pounds Fifteen Shillings and Six pence, In good fresh pork and Deliver it at the Landing of Mr. Jno. Jenings In pascotank on or before the 10th of December next then this Obligation to be void and of none Effect or Else to Remain In
