My dear Papa-

I have  
within the past few  
days received your  
letter of Dec 1<sup>st</sup> and  
must thank you  
again for writing  
to me. It does me  
a great deal of good

to get a letter  
from you in your  
own handwriting.

I believe that  
the last time I  
wrote you we were  
expected to leave  
Colmar-Berg on Dec 30  
and return to France.  
The order was changed  
however, and we  
only left there

yesterday and will leave  
this town tomorrow. We  
are evidently on our  
way back to France but  
how long it will take  
us to get to America, it  
is hard to say now. Tho'  
we are now hearing  
persistent rumors to the  
~~effect that we will embark~~  
for home about Aug. 16th.  
We are not however putting  
any great amount of faith  
in rumors but are  
trusting that it will be  
true in this particular  
case. We have had a

very pleasant trip  
to this little country  
and have been well  
received by the  
people but I must  
still say that I  
have met no people  
in Europe to compare  
with the French.

I have just

received a letter  
from Bessie written  
from Edenton on Dec  
4th and was so  
glad that she was  
with you all for  
Christmas. Her

children must be  
a great comfort to  
you and I am  
looking forward toward

I hope that you  
are feeling about as  
usual and I am anxiety  
awaiting ~~the~~ the time when  
I shall return home to  
see you and to do what  
little help I can to you

This town is only  
5 miles from the city of  
Luxemburg where I have  
been several times. I  
went over last night to  
a dance. It was Sunday night  
but Sunday nights are the  
nights for dancing in this  
country. Love to you all
