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

THE LOST COLONY FILM

The Lost Colony Film was made on Roanoke Island in 1921, and is the oldest North Carolina film extant. The 45 minute silent film tells the familiar tale of England's unsuccessful attempts to settle Roanoke Island in the years 1584- 1587. Shot in 35mm by a professional crew of three, the film features local amateur performers in rather elaborate and historically accurate costumes and sets. Produced by the State Board of Education in collaboration with the State Historical Commission, this was to have been the first in a series, "North Carolina Pictorial History," but none followed. In its original release, the film was shown extensively in schools and communities throughout the state.

After being out of circulation for decades, *The Lost Colony Film* is once again available for booking. Tom Whiteside, Visiting Artist at Halifax Community College in Weldon, has been showing the movie to audiences throughout the state since April of 1986. Tom has done extensive research in North Carolina film history, and he believes that people should work to better understand the media of motion pictures "because it is the most powerful mode of communication in our world."

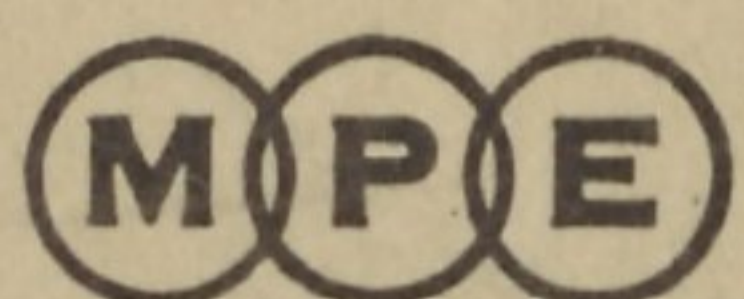


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
