B.A. in Music from Campbell University, which recently honored him with a Distinguished Alumnus citation. He also attended Indiana University and the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill where he received his Master of Music Degree in 1968.

He. remained with the Metropolitan Opera Studio for three years and then debuted with the San Francisco Opera Company in Peter Grimes.

He has performed a wide range of roles, including Figaro in The Barber of Seville, Marcello in La Boheme, Sharpless in Madame Butterfly, Escamille in Carmen, Papagenc in The Magic Flute, Count Almavina in The Marriage of Figaro, Robert Lincoln in the TV production of The Trial of Mary Lincoln, and Von Trapp in Sound of Music.

Upcoming engagements for 1980 include performances in the St. Louis Opera in January, the New Cleveland Opera in February, the Pittsburgh Opera in April, the Philadelphia Opera also in April, and at Kennedy Center in July.

At the Buies Creek concert Turnage will be accompanied at the piano by Mrs. Taylor Newton, another native of the Dunn area. A public school music teacher, she is a long-time organist at Dunn's First Baptist Church and is active in other church activities and civic affairs.
