Greenville, N.C., September ——Students at East Carolina College now enrolled in the college Air Force ROTC unit number 394, an increase of more than 100 students over last year's registration, according to figures from the office of Major Lomax L. May, professor of air science and tactics.

Among members of the college unit, 196 are freshmen. For the first time the unit is offering this fall a course in Flight Operations, enrollment in which is limited to thirty cadets, all first year advanced students. Fifty-five other first year advanced students are taking courses in Administration-Logistics.

Major May heads a staff of ten instructors in charge of ROTC work at the college. This number represents an increase of four members over last year's staff, the additions being made because of the larger student enrollment this fall.

In addition to the regular training program, the East Carolina ROTO unit also gives training to a rifle marksmanship team, a rifle drill team, a drum and bugle corps, and other related military activities.

Approximately 85% of the commissioned graduates from East Carolina, states Major May, are on active duty with the United States Air Force. This figure represents approximately 35 graduates of the college.
