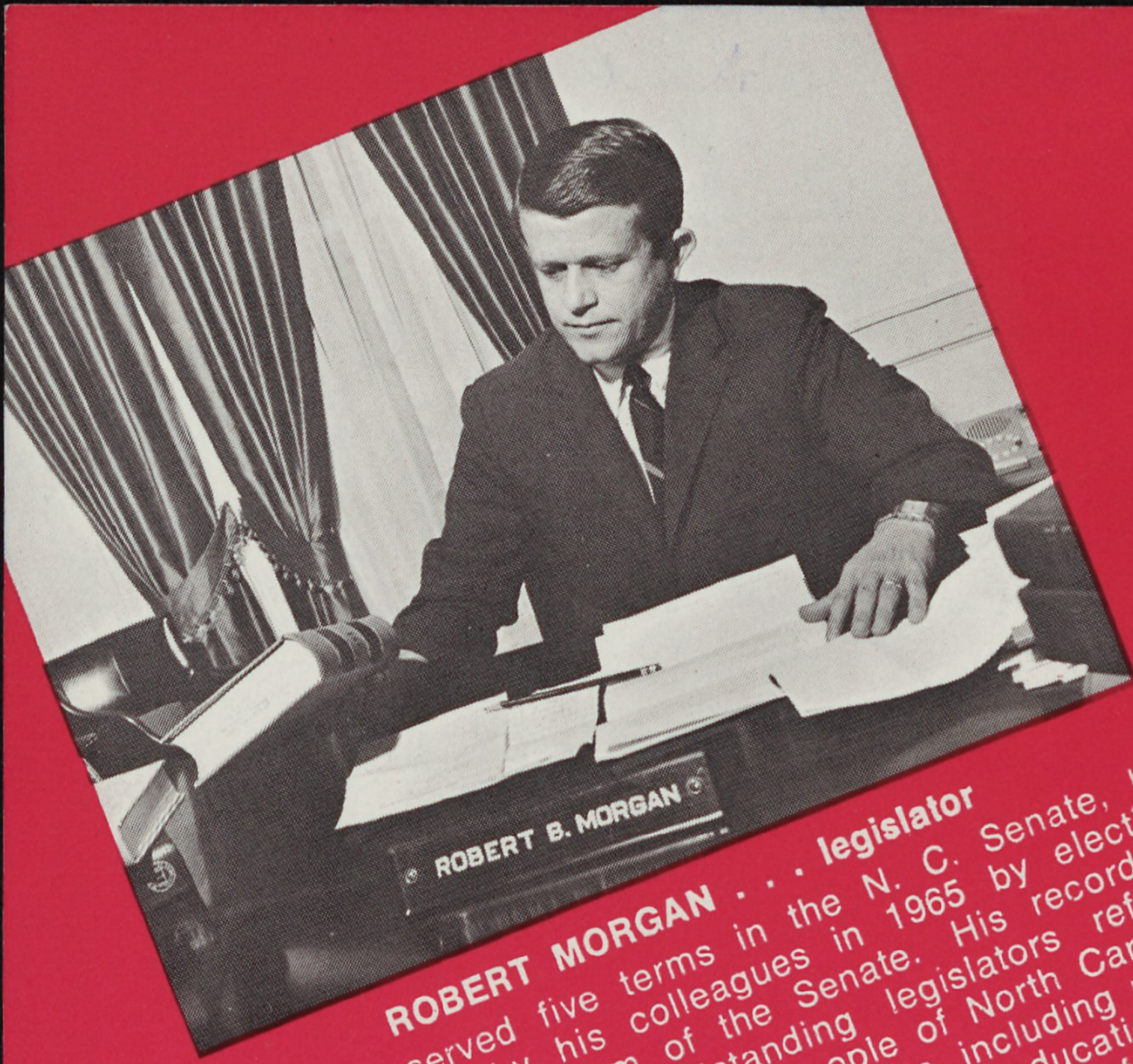
SERVED HIS COUNTRY TWICE

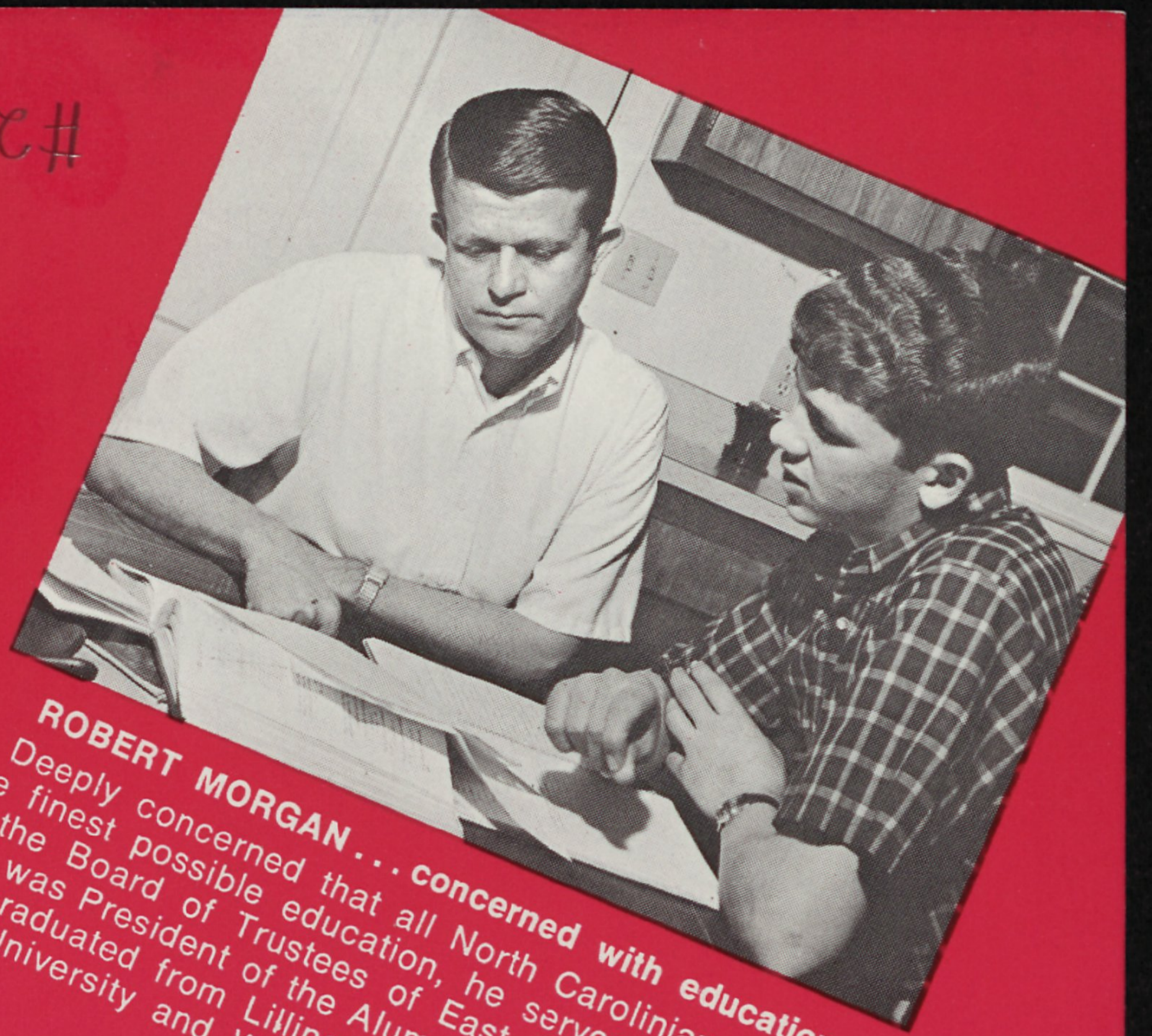

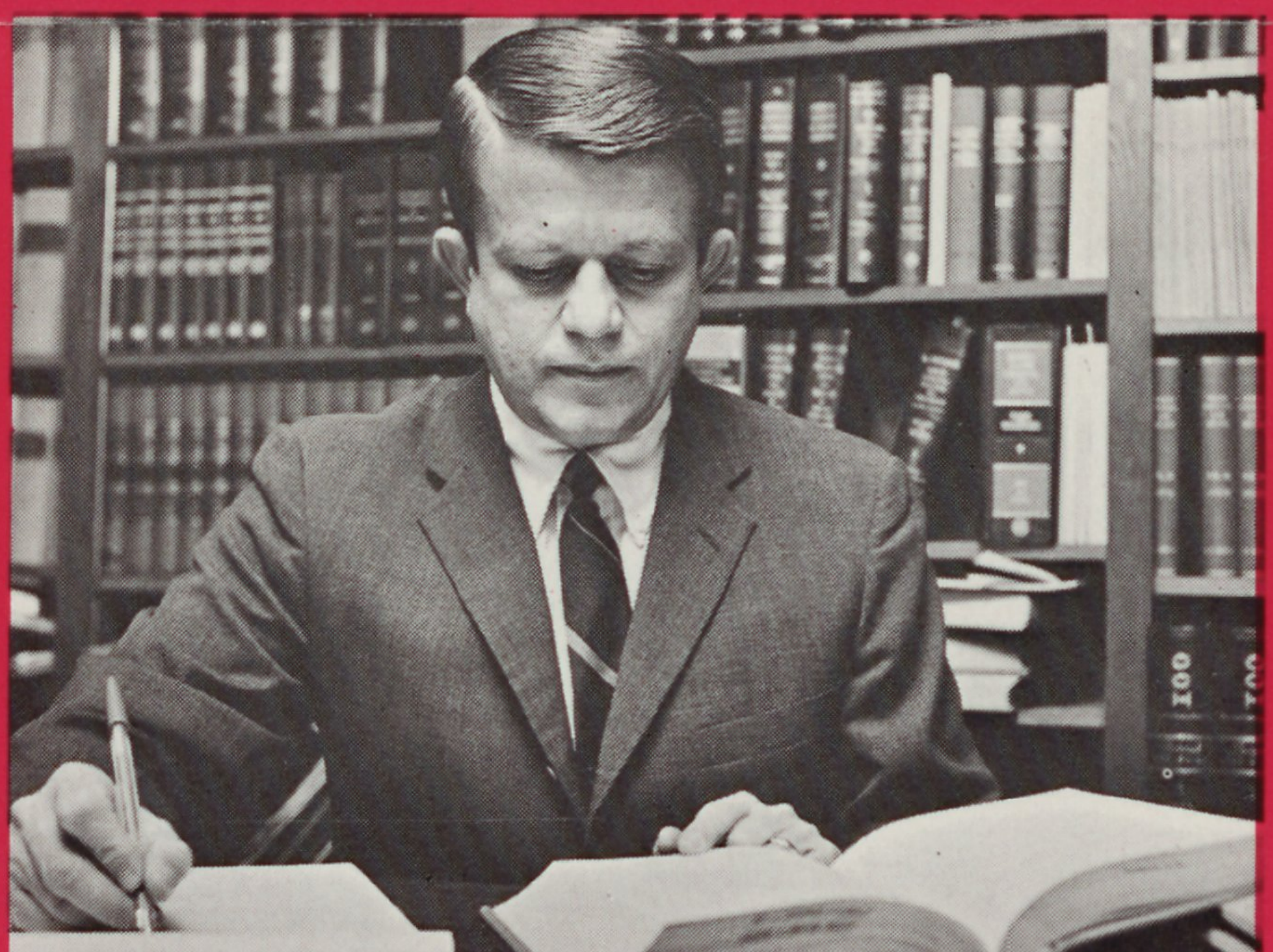
ROBERT MORGAN . . . family man
