

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

Even today, corny as it may be, I believe in truth, justice and the American Way (that is, hard-headed individuality). I realize that those things are in short supply, and always have been, but still I persist.

Now, maybe I'm making a rather obvious point. We're all shaped by our childhoods in one way or another. But my generation in particular seems to have been shaped by the media more than its parents. I mean, my parents never gave me any lectures on justice and individuality, but Spider-Man certainly did. I'm sure that by the time that movie rolls around, we'll all be sick to death of hearing about it. But I'm still glad it's coming.

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

First we have the high-art approach. There is a jazz/lounge version that sounds a lot like the Manhattan Transfer, or a very bad version of them. Then there is the operatic version, which is not all that bad, but still a bit silly. And last on the high-art tip is a dramatic reading of the song without any music; it makes a good poem with its steady rhythm and rhyme.

The song is also done in the styles of many Zeppelin's contemporaries in




