



If you have not already made contact with The Career Center, it is never too late. The center describes their primary focus as providing assistance and guidance to students and alumni in their career quest. One little known fact about The Career Center is that they are available to help students at any point in their college career, whether they are freshman, soon to graduate seniors or alumni. This resource, which is a department within the division of Academic Affairs, helps students to fine tune their job-hunting skills and increase their confidence in highstress interview situations. The Career Center uses a system they call e3, a combination of student exploration, experience and engagement in community resources. As described on their Web site, "Exploration is the foundation, Experience is the practical application and Engagement is the point where you take control of your destiny." Community resources range from members of the university, employers, agencies and other external populations such as other university populations. Through their well-connected network, The Career Center can keep many employers as their partners, which can help students to initiate opportunities in public, private, governmental and corporate sectors of work. They provide workshops, programs and opportunities for students that will help improve and encourage career exploration, practical work experience and professional development.
