piece then Southwardly and westerly with the S. patent Line to bartlets line
Then with Bartlets Line to the Lightwood post

To have and to Hold the above S. Bargained Lands and primites —
With all the appertainencies priviledges and Commodities of & in any wise
appertaining thereunto unto him the S. Bartlet Jones he his heirs Ex:
administrators or assignes, and do warrant Seare and defend the S. land
and primites against the Lawfull Claims of All my heirs Ex: ad:
for Ever unto the S. Bartlet Jones he his Heirs Ex: ad: and assignes
in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this
Seventh day of february in the year of our Lord God one Thousand
