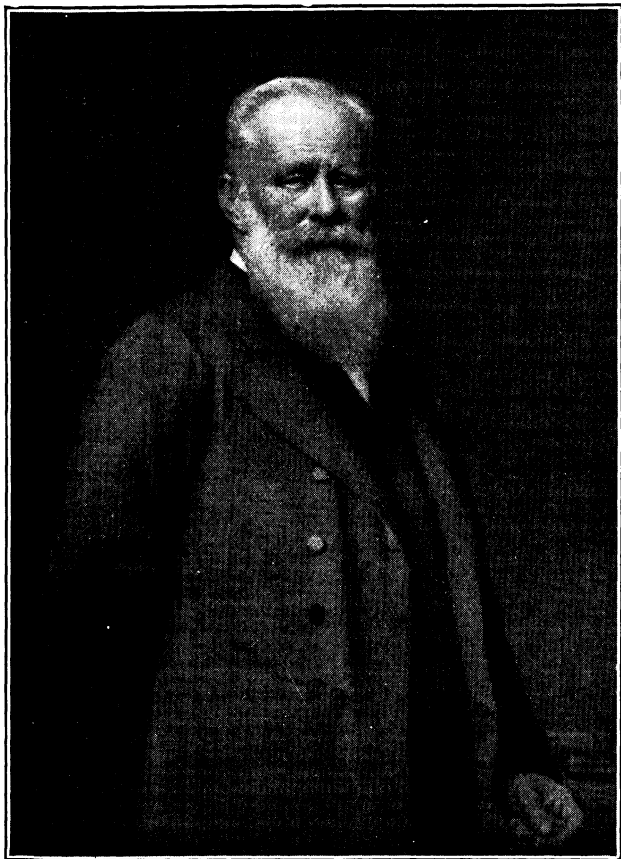

HERMANN NOTHNAGEL.

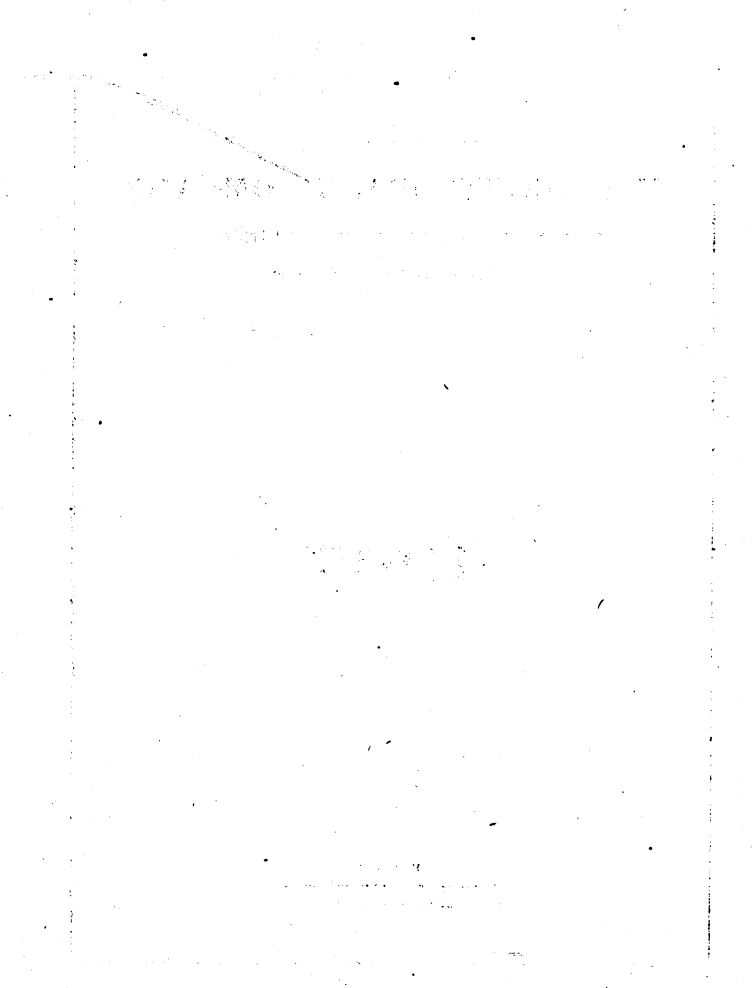
"Only a good man can be a good physician."

Hermann Nothnagel, one of the world's greatest physicians, was born September 28, 1841, in the province of Brandenburg. He studied medicine in Berlin, where he graduated in 1863. The teachers that exerted the greatest influence on him were Traube and Virchow. From 1865 to 1868 he was Leyden's assistant in Königsberg. In 1872 he was called to the professorship of medicine in Freiburg, and in 1874 to Jena. In 1882 he was called to occupy the most coveted chair of internal medicine in Vienna, where he remained until his death. His monumental encyclopedia, his text-book and numerous other writings are almost as well-known in this country as they are in Europe. As a lecturer, Nothnagel had few equals, and those who heard him will never forget his clear, concise language, his earnest, humane manner. At every opportunity he endeavored to inculcate his favorite axiom: "Only a good man can be a good physician." He died rather suddenly on the night of July 6, 1905, from arteriosclerosis of the coronary arteries. While his death was rather sudden to the public at large, it was not sudden to himself. He knew his condition and expected his death at any time. When his last attack came on he took careful notes of his pulse and other symptoms and jotted them down on paper. He wrote almost to the last minute—to his very last breath. His funeral was a national affair.

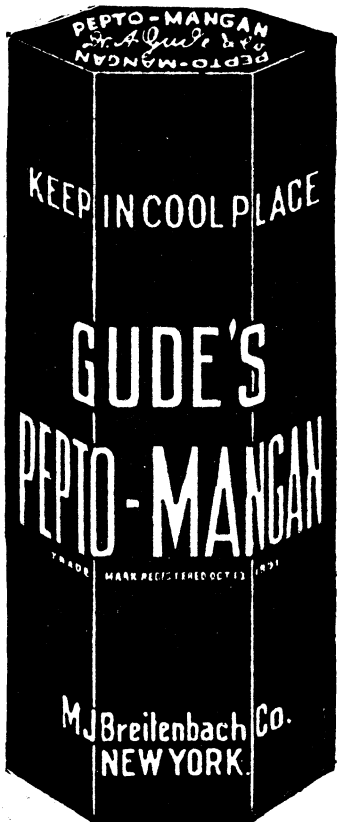

The duration of human pregnancy is about 275 days. This is subject to some variation, and the longest period is still undetermined. As labor occurs in the larger proportion of cases between 270 and 290 day- from the last menstruation, it is usual to reckon either from the first or last day of this period, taking as the mean 280 days, or a little over nine calendar months. For this approximate calculation the first day of the menstrual period may be used as being more readily ascertained. The table presents at a glance the beginning and end of 280 days for every day of the year. Find the date of menstruation in the upper line of the horizontal row, and the figure below, with the corresponding month, will indicate 280 days. In leap year, if the period of pregnancy includes February, the time for labor will be one day earlier than that given in the table.
