from each on-campus resid from each on-campus residence hall must become an ele
member of congress member of congress.
Abey Dessie, SGA attor general, ruled that Article II is structurally unconstitutional at the Oct. 22 congress meeting. However, Dessie also
ruled that SGA congress may continue to perform official business such as approving new organizations, granting emergency funding, voting on
student fees and passing resolu student fees and passing resolu-
tions that respond to university policies and procedures.
