Re: Polio Campaign

My dear Dr. Clement:

We feel that the Oral Polio Campaign was imminently successful in this county. We gave approximately 50,000 doses on Polio Sunday and at least 4,000 doses the following week. We collected above \$8100. Our present bills, mine included, will not amount to more than \$5000. A few suggestions and points for discussion are listed for the next two Sundays:

1. We have several choices as far as records are concerned. We can proceed like they are in Greensboro and in Beaufort Co. and destroy all the permissions. Legal advisors at both places advise no difficulty if this is done.


2. We can use our present alphabetized records for permissions and notify each person to make a permanent record of immunizations at school and in private physicians' offices.

3. We can keep our present system, have additional help registering at the next clinics, and have more records because people are not going to the same clinics.

We will need to decide at the next medical meeting about any further details in publicity. Several people have suggested microphones on cars rather than the airplane microphones. I have obtained details about this and will report if the Society requests.

The Polio Committee has received words of commendation from the Board of Health and we wish to express our gratification to all the people in Pitt County who participated in such a magnificent way in this program.
