Dear Leo:

I hope to attend the meeting of the Board on <u>May 27</u>. However, if anything prevents my getting there I wish you would submit the following to the board as my preference.

The college cannot much longer refuse to admit nonwhite students who fully and completely qualify. As you know, State College, the University at Chapel Hill and Woman's College have granted such admissions for the past few years.

And you have noted the recent action of trustees of Wake Forest, a non-state supported institution, in opening their graduate department to qualified students.

We would be doing only what others are doing to put East Carolina quietly and without fanfare into the new stream. If we do not so act we shall in due time be the object of attention which might cause much more repercussions and reactions than admitting a few qualified ones.

There is every evidence from Washington that regulations concerning discrimination will be carefully observed. We have made loans from Federal agencies, we want to be in line for such aid as we may require in the future. A policy of non-discrimination would be helpful. A policy of barring non-whites may even see the college denied aid in some fields.

The board now is authorized under the charter to make a decision. The ban on other than white students was removed under the charter adopted when the Higher Board reorganization was put through. You will recall that originally the charter specified the college was for "white" students. When the new charter was passed by the Legislature, it evidently was anticipated that the college should be in position to act as wisdom indicated. Dr. Leo W. Jenkins
