Past Pirates still live on through celebrations of their lives

Students step up in planning memorial services

to the deaths of Pirates in three different incidents.
Kristina Hobbs, Jeff Linde and Justin Gross were all members of the ECU family who lost
their lives.

Kristina, murdered her and com-
mitted suicide on Jan. 9 . mitted suicide on Jan. 9 . on Feb. 5 in Hendrix Theater of
Mendenhall Student Center to pay tribute to Hobbs. The impact that Hobbs had on the students she worked with
was so great that they planned a was so great that they ylanned a memorial to pay their respects.
Kandus Simmons, ECU freshman, was the main facilitator in making sure that the vigil occurred.

lish a personal relationship with

"I did visit her outside of
when I specifically needed her

more as a friend," Simmons said.

according to Simmons.
Simmons voiced to the audi-
ence about how she became
acquainted with Hobbs and
expressed how much she would
be missed.
