Greenville, Oct. 3rd, 1923. We have spent one week in college, and a number of us have gotten our work straight, and attend that work regularly, the great majority of you have. We have this organism pretty well under way now. I want you to start in this week to meet every college obligation that you have. For a large number of you the kind of start you make is going to determine the success or failure of this year's work. A good beginning is quite often half the battle. So start in now\_to-day\_to do absolutely every duty of that day. Do each day's task to-day. Get busy with your routine of work, and you have no idea unless you have tried it before what it means to you in the way of satisfaction. Do you know young women that riches never produced happiness. I don't care how poor you are, you may look out and think how happy you would be if you had a good bank account, happiness doesn't come that way. Those rich people in the world who inherit their riches, as a class, are of all men most miserable not invariably but almost invariably he is not happy. Happiness comes from things within, not from things without. You will enjoy more the dollar you make than you will the \$5.00 that somebody gives you. I mean the thing that you do is the thing that produces happiness for you. It is something from within and not from without. Now get the application to your college work. Your teachers cannot help you but just a little bit. You say well why then have you employed such a large faculty of especially trained folks if they can't do much for us. We have secured these people because they know how not to help you, and thus how to help you most. You don't understand me, do you? You don't understand how he that would be greatest among you, let him be the servant. But it is true never-the-less. Now that person who learns from the school teacher how to do the thing himself is the only person that is really educated, and we are trying to help you but not helping you by offering suggestions. To help you in that way to get ready to teach children in the same way. "A" was in a large business. (This is a story that I am going to make up and tell, but it happens almost every day) "A" was in a large business in a very menial position. "A" said I don't like the job I have, but I like the concern I am working for. By the side of "A" was "B" who said the same thing. "A" said I am going to get a better job in this concern by doing better work on this job, and he mastered everything that he had to do, and when the time came to start he was always there and at work, and when the time came to stop he kept on and finished what he was doing. "A" was not the least bit jealous of anybody above him in
