Paul says that those people who resist the Roman law are going to be arrested and prosecuted. He did not mean that their souls will be lost necessarily, he is talking about temporal affairs not spiritual. He is telling them that the Roman government is going to enforce the Roman laws and that if they have no more sense then to disobey them then they will be punished.

Then he goes on to say that the law is not made for the right minded man, the person who loves his neighbor will not get in trouble. Have the right attitude towards the government and the right attitude towards your fellow man and you will stay out of trouble. It is a good chapter on citizenship and it is good advice to every person whether you be Christian or not. It is a lesson in government, it is a lesson in civics and it is also a lesson on one's attitude towards his fellow man. It is included in government, it is included in civics. I wish we could read this book of Romans in the spirit in which it was written by Paul and get the truths that he was trying to preach to those people in the center of the greatest government at that time on the face of the earth. It would help us in our present day life.

You know in this book we call the Bible there is almost an unlimited number of guides for a person's temporal conduct as well as the spiritual guide for one. If we could realize as Paul fully realized that government is absolutely necessary and that certain regulations are absolutely essential for human beings to live together and that freedom is not license to do as one pleases but that real freedom is that latitude that comes to one if he has conformed to the general regulations that are good for the whole body. In other words, it is freedom under the law and not license against the law. The greatest amount of freedom in this world comes to one when he conforms to the great principles of government that must be conformed to in
