To whom it may concern, I hereby certify that I was well acquainted with Wm Gardner of this City now dead, since Jan 1st 1872 and his physician from that date to the day of his death and during the whole period to my personal knowledge he was a great sufferer from a complication of diseases, principally Rheumatism & heart complications palpitation and irregularity of the action of the heart - I was called to visit him March 22 1887 a few weeks prior to his death - I found him suffering great pains in the region of his back & right shoulder same with irregularity & inflammation of the parts about the back & shoulder & with poor, pain, tension & swelling Phlegmonous in character and resulted in death July 6th 1887 - cause of death Ephestration from inanition

C. who being duly sworn according to Law declares that he has been acquainted with Sergeant Wm Gardner in Spring of 1863 just prior to his Enlisting I Enrolled in June 1863 in Co. K 55 Regt. U. S. A. and he Enlisted in Co. B 35 Regt. U. S. A. he was then a well and sound and healthy man I did only see him and I never heard him complain of any thing not until July 20 1864 when

he got shot at Battle of Olustee Fla I was wound at
 the same time and place, he was shot in the right arm
 and he got struck by Limb at Battle of Olustee Fla 1864 in
 the right side I was present when he was shot and struck and
 saw him in a few minutes after he was struck he had to
 be taken off the field, and was sent to the Hospital and
 after he was discharge & come home I saw him once or twice
 a week every week except when I would be down sick
 or he would be down sick from the wound and I know
 that he continued to linger with the effects of the wounds until
 they resulted in his death, I have every reason to know and
 believe it cause his death he died on the 6 day of July 1887 I was
 present when he was buried he was buried by Section post
 No. 22 and left surviving a widow and three children his widow
 Laura Gardner was his legal and lawful widow by reason of knowing
 is this I was present and saw Chaplin Thomas & Hoss Chaplin of Legt
 I married them they was married on about 26 day of May 1866 at Sumner
 Hill N.C. it was just before we left for Cholden N.C. to be discharge he and
 I come home together and he left his wife at Sumner Hill N.C. and he
 sent for her right away and she come in July 1866 & on about Decmber 1870

 truly ask as poor Invalid Soldier that
 my claim be taken up and settled
 through these 23 years many times have


