Scripture lesson: 12th Chapter, Book of Romans

Solomon said there was nothing new under the sun, but they didn't have radios at that time. We have a radio station in Greenville, and some of our students are going down and broadcasting, as representatives from the college. If the radio people will pay you something for broadcasting, all well and good, but you must have the right kind of permission from the college. When you go on the air as a representative of the college the outside world is going to judge the college by what you do. So in the future, no broadcasting will be permitted from the college students until they have the right kind of permission from the Dean of Women or the Dean of Men. It is too important a thing for us to let go on without knowing what is being broadcast. Now, so far as I know there hasn't been anything on the air we would seriously object to, but I haven't heard it all. We want the college advertised, but we want it properly advertised, and we want the correct impression made.

There is one other thing I have to talk to you about this morning, that I hate to talk about. I was standing in the men's room this morning and saw four students, girls and boys, walking along the campus, in an attitude toward each other I simply can't stand in this college. If a girl can't walk without swinging on to a boy she belongs somewhere besides in this college. I won't have this if I have to pick somebody up and expel them from the campus. If you young men have such an attitude toward womanhood that you can't walk around the campus with a girl without putting your arms around her you don't belong in this college. And if you girls you don't belong here either.
