

This indenture made this 21st day of July A.D. 1883. Between Beverly B
Wooten and Harriet L. Wooten wife of Beverly B Wooten of the County of
Lincoln and State of North Carolina party of the first part, and J. F.
Wooten party of the second part of same county & State, It is made
that the party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum
of one thousand dollars to them in hand paid by the party of the
second part, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged have
given granted bargained sold and conveyed, and by these
present do give grant bargain sell and convey to the party of the
second part his heirs and assigns all that part or parcel of land, heretofore
conveyed to the said Beverly B Wooten by deed from J. F. Wooten
on the 9th day of July A.D. 1882. Bounded as follows: Beginning at the
bridge a cross oak Branch Canal on the public road leading from
Kinston to Lenoir, and runs south with the Canal to a light wood Stake on
the Canal bank opposite to an old ditch running from the road around the
fence leading from the Council Gardens old place to Gabriel Cox
and from the light wood Stake with the old ditch a direct line,
to where it strikes the dividing line between the said J. F. Wooten
and Gabriel Cox land, and from said point of intersection north
with said line to the public road leading from Kinston to Lenoir
and thence with said road west to the bridge the beginning containing
by estimation one hundred and fifty acres, the said land is in
Lenoir County - To have and to hold the above described land
with all the appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said J. F. Wooten
and his heirs in fee simple, and do hereby agree to warrant
the title to said J. F. Wooten and his heirs against all persons
claiming under the said Beverly B Wooten In witness
